## AN ACT

1 2 4 5 6 7 8 9	Amending Title 37 (Historical and Museums) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for definitions; in powers and duties of Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, further providing for specific powers and duties, for personal property and for documents; providing for Commonwealth archival records, for local government archival records and for access to older public records; in historic properties, further providing for powers over certain historic property; and prescribing a penalty.
11	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
12	hereby enacts as follows:
13	Section 1. Section 103 of Title 37 of the Pennsylvania
14	Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding definitions to read:
15	§ 103. Definitions.
16	Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent
17	provisions of this title which are applicable to specific
18	provisions of this title, the following words and phrases when
19	used in this title shall have the meanings given to them in this
20	section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
21	* * *

1	"Archival record." A record having sufficient historical
2	value to warrant permanent preservation by the Commonwealth or a
3	unit of local government.
4	* * *
5	"Record." A record as defined in section 102 of the act of
6	February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law.
7	* * *
8	"State Archives." The Pennsylvania State Archives
9	administered by the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum
10	<u>Commission.</u>
11	"State Archivist." The Director of the Pennsylvania State
12	Archives.
13	Section 2. Section 302(12) of Title 37 is amended to read:
14	§ 302. Specific powers and duties.
15	The commission shall have the power and duty to:
16	* * *
17	(12) Annual reportsAnnually transmit to the State
18	Government Committees of the House of Representatives and the
19	Senate a report which includes the following:
20	(i) A summary of the overall condition of museums
21	and historic sites and holdings, including staffing
22	levels and site visits by senior management personnel.
23	[(ii) A report on the operation of the Conservation
24	Center.]
25	(iii) A summary of all publications completed by the
26	commission during the prior year.
27	(iv) A summary of collection deaccessioning
28	activities.
29	(v) A summary of the progress in computerization of
30	collections and inventories.
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Section 3. Section 304(4) of Title 37 is amended and the section is amended by adding a paragraph to read: \$ 304. Personal property.

5 The commission shall have the power and duty to:

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7 Sale or other disposition. -- Exchange or otherwise (4) 8 dispose of material with other museums, archival 9 repositories, historical societies or other reliable 10 organized groups of an educational nature; and sell at public auction historical artifacts, pursuant to its rules and 11 12 regulations, provided that an historical artifact shall not 13 be sold at public auction unless the commission has 14 determined that the exchange or disposal of that artifact by 15 the other means authorized by this paragraph is not feasible 16 and that the property would not be beneficial to the 17 commission if it were used other than as an artifact. [If the 18 original donor was an individual, the original donor shall be 19 notified, if he can be located, and, if the original donor is 20 deceased, his children shall be notified, if they can be 21 located, and be given an opportunity to reacquire the object, 22 prior to its being offered at auction. If the original donor was not an individual, the original donor shall be notified, 23 24 if it or its successor can be located, and be given an 25 opportunity to reacquire the object, prior to its being 26 offered at auction. The opportunity of an original donor to 27 reacquire an object shall not be construed to diminish the commission's control over an historical artifact subsequent 28 29 to its acquisition by the commission and prior to its 30 disposition.] These sales shall be conducted by the

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1 Department of General Services. Income produced through these sales shall be paid into the State Treasury through the 2 Department of Revenue and credited to the Historical 3 Preservation Fund and allocated solely for collection 4 5 acquisition or conservation purposes. No unique object, 6 article, manuscript, document or other material, which is of 7 special significance to the history of this Commonwealth, 8 shall be sold. \* \* \* 9 (6) Abandoned property on loan. -- Sell or otherwise 10 dispose of property on loan to the commission in accordance 11 12 with the following: 13 (i) Notwithstanding the provisions of Article XIII.1 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as 14 15 The Fiscal Code, and unless there exists a written agreement to the contrary, any property on loan to the 16 17 commission for 21 years or more and for which no person has made a claim according to records maintained by the 18 19 commission shall be considered abandoned if the 20 commission has made reasonable efforts to locate and 21 notify the original lender. 22 (ii) If no valid claim has been made to the property 23 within 60 days after the date of the last notice provided 24 by the commission, the commission shall have the 25 authority to sell or otherwise dispose of the property. Section 4. Section 305 of Title 37 is amended to read: 26 § 305. [(1)] (2) Research on Commonwealth documents.--Examine and copy or microfilm any public records within the control of a Commonwealth agency for the purposes of historical research.

7 [(2)] (3) Preservation of public records.--Preserve all 8 public records throughout this Commonwealth and give special 9 attention to the preservation of all records of the 10 Commonwealth not in current use and of historical value; negotiate for the transfer and receipt of public records from 11 12 any Commonwealth agency or political subdivision; and provide 13 for the disposition of records not needed or useful in the 14 transaction of current or anticipated future work of the 15 Commonwealth under section 524 of the act of April 9, 1929 16 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929. 17 The commission shall be the legal custodian of any public records transferred to it by any Commonwealth agency or 18 political subdivision. The head of any Commonwealth agency or 19 20 political subdivision may transfer to the commission public 21 records legally in his custody not needed for the transaction 22 of the business of the office whenever the commission is 23 willing to receive and care for them.

[(3)] (4) Management of historical documents.--Collect, classify, preserve and make available for reference all records which may come into its possession with the exceptions indicated by the commission; and examine the condition of the public records, books, pamphlets, documents, manuscripts, archives, maps and papers filed or recorded in any Commonwealth agency or political subdivision. The

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executive director or any employees authorized by him shall have reasonable access to all public records in this Commonwealth for the purpose of examining them and shall report to the commission on their condition.

5 [(4)] (5) Regulation of Commonwealth records.--Recommend 6 such action be taken by the persons having the care and 7 custody of public records as may be necessary to secure their 8 safety and preservation; cause all laws relating to public 9 records to be enforced; and recommend and enforce uniform 10 standards governing the use of paper, ink and filing 11 procedure for all records and papers of Commonwealth agencies 12 and political subdivisions that are considered of permanent 13 historical importance.

14 [(5)] (6) Certificates relating to public records.-15 Furnish certificates relating to public records, or copies
16 thereof, upon the payment of fees established by the
17 commission or otherwise fixed by law.

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[(6)] <u>(7)</u> Land records.--Maintain and preserve:

19 (i) Records of the first titles acquired by the
20 proprietaries and the Commonwealth to all the lands
21 within its boundaries.

(ii) Records of all lands and conveyances from the proprietaries and the Commonwealth to the purchasers of the land.

(iii) Papers relating to the surveys of this
Commonwealth and county lines and the reports of
commissioners relating to the boundary lines of this
Commonwealth.

29 (iv) Maps and other papers pertaining to the30 colonial history of this Commonwealth.

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1	(v) Contracts, section profile maps and other
2	records relating to public works.
3	(vi) All other relevant records relating to titles
4	of real estate acquired by the Commonwealth.
5	(8) Protection and recovery of Commonwealth records
6	Maintain and preserve Commonwealth records in accordance with
7	its powers and duties under section 305.1 (relating to
8	<u>Commonwealth archival records).</u>
9	(9) Protection and recovery of local government
10	recordsMaintain and preserve local government records in
11	accordance with its powers and duties under section 305.2
12	(relating to local government archival records).
13	(10) Access to older public recordsEnsure access to
14	older public records in accordance with its powers and duties
15	under section 305.3 (relating to access to older public
16	records).
17	Section 5. Title 37 is amended by adding sections to read:
18	<u>§ 305.1. Commonwealth archival records.</u>
19	(a) Statement of policyIt is the policy of the
20	Commonwealth that Commonwealth records belong to the citizens of
21	this Commonwealth.
22	(b) Sale or transfer of Commonwealth archival records
23	prohibitedA person may not sell, transfer or otherwise
24	alienate a Commonwealth archival record unless specifically
25	authorized by law or established by approved record retention
26	procedures of the Commonwealth. In addition to any other penalty
27	provided by law, a person who violates this subsection may be
28	subject to a civil penalty of not more than \$2,500.
29	(c) Commission authorityThe commission as part of its
30	responsibilities for the operation of the State Archives may

1	demand the return of any Commonwealth archival record in the
2	possession of a person, organization, institution or other
3	entity if removal of the record from Commonwealth possession was
4	not authorized by the Commonwealth.
5	(d) Notice and demand of returnWhen the executive
6	director, in consultation with the State Archivist, has
7	reasonable grounds to believe that a Commonwealth archival
8	record is in the possession of a person, organization,
9	institution or other entity not authorized by law to possess
10	that record, the commission may issue written notice and demand
11	to that person, organization, institution or other entity for
12	the immediate return of the record. The notice and demand shall
13	be sent by certified or registered mail, return receipt
14	requested. The notice and demand shall identify the Commonwealth
15	archival record claimed with reasonable specificity. Upon
16	receipt of the notice and demand, the person, organization,
17	institution or other entity in the possession of the
18	Commonwealth archival record shall not destroy, alter, transfer,
19	convey or otherwise alienate the record unless authorized in
20	writing by the executive director or by an order issued by a
21	court of competent jurisdiction.
22	(e) PetitionIf the person, organization, institution or
23	other entity in possession of the Commonwealth archival record
24	refuses or fails to deliver the record on demand, the commission
25	may petition Commonwealth Court for recovery of the record.
26	(f) Seizure of Commonwealth archival recordsAt any time
27	after or contemporaneous with the filing of a petition under
28	subsection (e), the commission may petition the court to have
29	the record seized if there are reasonable grounds to believe the
30	record is in danger of being destroyed, mutilated, altered,
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1	secreted, sold or otherwise removed from the unauthorized
2	possession of a person, organization, institution or other
3	entity. The order of seizure shall issue with notice to the
4	respondent upon seizure and without the posting of any bond or
5	other security by the petitioner.
6	(g) PresumptionIn any proceeding pursuant to subsection
7	(e), there is a rebuttable presumption that Commonwealth
8	archival records that were once in the custody of the
9	Commonwealth were not lawfully alienated from that custody.
10	§ 305.2. Local government archival records.
11	(a) General ruleIf a local government agency has
12	reasonable grounds to believe that a local government archival
13	record is in the possession of a person, organization,
14	institution or other entity not authorized by the local
15	government agency to possess that record, it may request the
16	commission to act on its behalf pursuant to the procedures
17	specified in section 305.1 (relating to Commonwealth archival
18	records) or may undertake on its own behalf the same procedure
19	available to the commission under section 305.1.
20	(b) Preservation of record statusUpon receipt of the
21	notice and demand from the commission or a local government
22	agency issued pursuant to this section, the person,
23	organization, institution or other entity in the possession of
24	the local archival record claimed to belong to the local
25	government agency may not destroy, alter, transfer, convey or
26	otherwise alienate the record unless authorized by the local
27	government agency or by an order issued by a court of competent
28	jurisdiction.
29	(c) Commission actionIf requested by a local government
30	agency to act under subsection (a), the commission may demand
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1	return of a local archival record in the private possession of a
2	person, organization, institution or other entity if removal of
3	the record from government possession was not authorized by the
4	local government agency.
5	§ 305.3. Access to older public records.
6	(a) AccessAny provision of law that exempts from public
7	disclosure any item in the custody of the State Archives shall
8	not apply to that item 75 years after the item was created,
9	irrespective of:
10	(1) The origin of the item.
11	(2) The manner in which it was deposited with the State
12	Archives.
13	(3) Any other condition or circumstance at the time the
14	item was deposited.
15	(b) ApplicabilitySubsection (a) shall apply to any item
16	currently in the custody of the State Archives and any item
17	deposited in the State Archives after the effective date of this
18	section.
19	(c) Notification to depositorsThe State Archives shall
20	notify any party who deposits any item in the State Archives
21	after the effective date of this section of the provisions of
22	subsection (a).
23	(d) Public noticeThe commission's Internet website shall
24	include a public notice stating that on or after January 1,
25	2015, all items 75 years of age or older that are on deposit in
26	the State Archives shall be accessible to the public.
27	(e) ConstructionIf the provisions of this section
28	conflict with any State law limiting disclosure of vital
29	statistics or sealed records or with Federal law, the provisions
30	of this section shall not apply.
