AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in powers of department and local authorities, further providing for promulgation of rules and regulations by department.

5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

6 hereby enacts as follows:

7 Section 1. Section 6103(c) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania

8 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:

9 § 6103. Promulgation of rules and regulations by department.

11 (c) Adoption of Federal statute, regulation, standard or

12 criteria. -- The department shall be authorized to adopt by

13 reference any Federal statute, regulation, standard or criteria

14 or provision thereof relating to vehicles or drivers, including,

15 but not limited to, minimum driver qualifications, maximum hours

16 of service, loading, unloading, hazardous materials, operation,

17 equipment, records and inspection[.] <u>subject to the following:</u>

18 (1) The department shall be authorized to extend the

19 coverage of any Federal statute, regulation, standard or

criteria adopted under this subsection to vehicles and drivers operating only in intrastate commerce, except as follows:

(iii) No Federal statute, regulation, standard or criteria shall be extended to cover farm [tractors or drivers of farm tractors, regardless of whether the farm tractor is operated as a combination.] vehicles with a biennial certificate of exemption or combinations powered by the farm vehicles or to drivers of the vehicles or combinations, that are operated in accordance with section 1302(10) (relating to vehicles exempt from registration), except for vehicles and combinations transporting hazardous materials in quantities that require the vehicle or combination to be placarded in accordance with department regulations.

- (iv) No Federal statute, regulation, standard or criteria shall be extended to cover implements of husbandry [other than farm tractors, farm vehicles or drivers of these vehicles, regardless of whether the vehicle is operated as a combination, provided that:
 - (A) the vehicle's or combination's gross weight, gross vehicle weight rating or gross combination weight rating does not equal or exceed 26,001 pounds;
 - (B) the vehicle or combination is not carrying hazardous materials in an amount that requires the towing or towed vehicle to be placarded under Chapter 83 (relating to hazardous materials transportation); and
 - (C) the vehicle or combination is not designed or used to transport 16 or more people, including the

driver.] exempt from the registration, or

combinations powered by the implements or to drivers

of the vehicles or combinations, that are operated or

moved in accordance with section 1302(2.1) or (2.2),

exempt for implements and combinations transporting

hazardous materials in quantities that require the

vehicle or combination to be placarded in accordance

with the department regulations.

[(v) For purposes of this paragraph, the term "farm tractors" includes tractors designed for off-road agricultural use, combines, crop pickers, crop and forage harvesters, threshers, plows, tillers, planters, seeders, field sprayers, forage cutters, balers and similar vehicles that are infrequently operated or moved upon highways and that are used by a farmer in agricultural production.]

- [(2) The regulations promulgated by the department under paragraph (1) may be modified, but shall, to the maximum extent possible, be consistent with safety and correspond to Federal regulations, standards or criteria.
- 23 paragraph (1) shall not cause the forfeiture or withholding
 24 of Federal funding. If a regulation promulgated under
 25 paragraph (1) results in a forfeiture or withholding of
 26 Federal funding, the regulation shall be void, and the
 27 department shall publish notice of the voided regulation in
 28 the Pennsylvania Bulletin.]
