AN ACT
Amending Title 4 (Amusements) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
Statutes, providing for entertainment machines.
The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Title 4 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

CHAPTER 13B

## ENTERTAINMENT MACHINES

S 13B01. Definitions.
The following words and phrases when used in this chapter shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
"Amusement machine." A machine that requires the insertion of a coin, currency or tokens to play or activate a game, the outcome of which is primarily determined by the skill of the player.
"Entertainment machine." An amusement machine, gaming
machine or video gaming machine.
"Certificate of registration." A form that certifies an entertainment machine is registered with the department.
"Gaming machine." A device or machine that requires the insertion of a coin, currency or tokens to play or activate a game that has the outcome of play primarily determined by chance. The term includes an antique slot machine under 18 Pa.C.S. § 5513(c) (relating to gambling devices, gambling, etc.) when used for profit. The term shall not include any of the following:
(1) A coin-operated amusement machine.
(2) A video lottery terminal that has all of its seals or identification plates.
(3) Slot machines as defined under section 1103 (relating to definitions).
(4) A game of chance under the act of December 19, 1988 (P.L.1262, No.156), known as the Local Option Small Games of Chance Act.
(5) Lottery terminals under the act of August 26, 1971 (P.L.351, No.91), known as the State Lottery Law. "Licensed establishment." A restaurant, bar, tavern, hotel or club that has a valid liquor or malt or brewed beverage license under Article IV of the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code.
"Video gaming machine." A device or machine that:
(1) upon insertion of a coin, currency or tokens will play or simulate the play of a video poker, bingo, keno, blackjack or any other game authorized by the department; and
(2) utilizes a video display and microprocessors.
§ 13B02. Operation of entertainment machines.
(d) Fee.--The application fee for a certificate of registration may not exceed $\$ 1,000$.
(e) Expiration.--A certificate of registration shall expire no later than one vear from the date of issuance by the
department.
§ 13B04. Certification stamp.
(a) Issuance.--The department shall issue a certification
stamp to a licensed establishment that holds a certificate of
registration issued under section $13 A 03(b)$ (relating to
temporary table game regulations).
(b) Expiration date.--The department shall include the
expiration date of the certificate of registration and any other
information as required by the department.
S 13B05. Regulations.
The department shall promulgate regulations necessary to
effectuate this chapter.
Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
