AN ACT

- Amending Title 4 (Amusements) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for entertainment machines.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Title 4 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes
- 6 is amended by adding a chapter to read:
- 7 <u>CHAPTER 13B</u>
- 8 <u>ENTERTAINMENT MACHINES</u>
- 9 § 13B01. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 11 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 13 <u>"Amusement machine." A machine that requires the insertion</u>
- 14 of a coin, currency or tokens to play or activate a game, the
- 15 <u>outcome of which is primarily determined by the skill of the</u>
- 16 player.
- 17 "Entertainment machine." An amusement machine, gaming

- 1 machine or video gaming machine.
- 2 "Certificate of registration." A form that certifies an
- 3 entertainment machine is registered with the department.
- 4 "Gaming machine." A device or machine that requires the
- 5 insertion of a coin, currency or tokens to play or activate a
- 6 game that has the outcome of play primarily determined by
- 7 chance. The term includes an antique slot machine under 18
- 8 Pa.C.S. § 5513(c) (relating to gambling devices, gambling, etc.)
- 9 when used for profit. The term shall not include any of the
- 10 following:
- 11 (1) A coin-operated amusement machine.
- 12 (2) A video lottery terminal that has all of its seals
- or identification plates.
- 14 (3) Slot machines as defined under section 1103
- 15 (relating to definitions).
- 16 (4) A game of chance under the act of December 19, 1988
- 17 (P.L.1262, No.156), known as the Local Option Small Games of
- 18 <u>Chance Act.</u>
- 19 (5) Lottery terminals under the act of August 26, 1971
- 20 (P.L.351, No.91), known as the State Lottery Law.
- 21 <u>"Licensed establishment." A restaurant, bar, tavern, hotel</u>
- 22 or club that has a valid liquor or malt or brewed beverage
- 23 <u>license under Article IV of the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90,</u>
- 24 No.21), known as the Liquor Code.
- 25 "Video gaming machine." A device or machine that:
- 26 (1) upon insertion of a coin, currency or tokens will
- 27 play or simulate the play of a video poker, bingo, keno,
- 28 blackjack or any other game authorized by the department; and
- 29 <u>(2) utilizes a video display and microprocessors.</u>
- 30 § 13B02. Operation of entertainment machines.

- 1 An entertainment machine may not be operated in this
- 2 Commonwealth at a licensed establishment unless it meets all of
- 3 the following requirements:
- 4 (1) The licensed establishment submits an application to
- 5 <u>the department under section 13A02(a) (relating to regulatory</u>
- 6 <u>authority</u>).
- 7 (2) The entertainment machine is issued a valid
- 8 <u>certificate of registration under section 13A03(b) (relating</u>
- 9 <u>to temporary table game regulations).</u>
- 10 (3) A certification stamp is affixed to the
- 11 entertainment machine under section 13A03.
- 12 § 13B03. Operation of entertainment machines.
- 13 <u>(a) Application.--</u>
- 14 (1) A licensed establishment must submit an application
- to the department to operate an entertainment machine.
- 16 (2) The department shall develop guidelines on the
- 17 manner of completing an application. If an application does
- 18 not meet the department's guidelines, it may be rejected by
- the department.
- 20 (b) Issuance. -- No later than 30 days from the date the
- 21 department receives an application to operate an entertainment
- 22 machine, the department shall:
- 23 (1) issue a certificate of registration to the applicant
- for the entertainment machine if the department accepts the
- 25 application; or
- 26 (2) provide a notice of denial if the department denies
- 27 <u>the application.</u>
- 28 (c) Certificate form. -- A certificate of registration shall
- 29 be in a form developed by the department and shall be available
- 30 on the department's Internet website.

- 1 (d) Fee.--The application fee for a certificate of
- 2 registration may not exceed \$1,000.
- 3 (e) Expiration. -- A certificate of registration shall expire
- 4 no later than one year from the date of issuance by the
- 5 <u>department</u>.
- 6 § 13B04. Certification stamp.
- 7 (a) Issuance. -- The department shall issue a certification
- 8 stamp to a licensed establishment that holds a certificate of
- 9 registration issued under section 13A03(b) (relating to
- 10 <u>temporary table game regulations</u>).
- 11 (b) Expiration date. -- The department shall include the
- 12 expiration date of the certificate of registration and any other
- 13 <u>information as required by the department.</u>
- 14 § 13B05. Regulations.
- The department shall promulgate regulations necessary to
- 16 <u>effectuate this chapter.</u>
- 17 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
