AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Identity Theft Prevention and Restoration 2 Program.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Identity
- 7 Theft Prevention and Restoration Act.
- 8 Section 2. Establishment.
- 9 There is established the Identity Theft Prevention and
- 10 Restoration Program within the Office of Attorney General. The
- 11 program shall include the following:
- 12 (1) The development and distribution of information on
- 13 the prevention of identity theft to the public.
- 14 (2) The development and distribution of information on
- the restoration of personal information, including credit
- 16 card numbers, bank accounts, insurance information and Social
- 17 Security numbers.
- 18 (3) The development of an identity restoration program.

- 1 Section 3. Identity restoration program.
- 2 (a) Components. -- The identity restoration program
- 3 established under section 2 shall include:
- 4 (1) Step-by-step instructions on how to alert creditors,
- 5 financial institutions, insurance companies, government
- 6 agencies and other entities of identity theft.
- 7 (2) The issuance of identity theft identification cards
- 8 to enable an individual to demonstrate that the individual
- 9 has been the victim of identity theft.
- 10 (3) Access to an Internet website to transmit the
- application and police report to the Office of Attorney
- 12 General.
- 13 (4) The provision of Internet websites and toll-free
- telephone numbers of credit reporting agencies, services to
- remove a name from mailing lists and other appropriate
- 16 entities.
- 17 (b) Issuance. -- The following shall apply to the issuance of
- 18 an identity theft identification card under subsection (a) (2):
- 19 (1) To be eligible for an identity theft identification
- 20 card, an individual shall do all of the following:
- 21 (i) Report the crime to law enforcement.
- 22 (ii) File an application for an identity theft
- identification card and a police report with the Office
- of Attorney General.
- 25 (2) An application under paragraph (1) (ii) shall include
- 26 all of the following:
- 27 (i) The victim's name, address, telephone numbers
- and driver's license or State ID card number.
- 29 (ii) The reporting law enforcement officer's name,
- 30 agency name, telephone number and date of report.

- 1 (iii) The victim's signature under oath affirming
- 2 the accuracy of the information.
- 3 (iv) The victim's fingerprint and photograph.
- 4 (3) The Office of Attorney General shall do all of the following:
- 6 (i) Verify the information in the application and police report.
- 8 (ii) Issue an identification card with a unique 9 identification number for the individual.
- 10 (iii) Provide security measures to ensure the 11 reliability of the identity restoration program.
- 12 (iv) Develop a website to transmit applications and
 13 police reports directly to the Office of Attorney
 14 General.
- 15 Section 4. Implementation.
- 16 The Office of Attorney General shall develop the application,
- 17 websites and other components of the Identity Theft Prevention
- 18 and Restoration Program within six months of the effective date
- 19 of this section.
- 20 Section 20. Effective date.
- 21 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
