1 2 3	Designating the month of October 2014 as "Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
4	WHEREAS, More than six million people, or 11% of school-age
5	children and 4% of adults, in the United States have been
6	diagnosed with Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD);
7	and
8	WHEREAS, ADHD is one of the most common childhood disorders
9	and can continue through adolescence and adulthood; and
10	WHEREAS, The average age of onset is seven years of age and
11	boys are four times more at risk than girls; and
12	WHEREAS, ADHD is a neurobehavioral disorder and the primary
13	symptoms include inattention, impulsiveness and hyperactivity;

15	WHEREAS, ADHD causes challenges in how well children perform
16	in school, in their ability to make and keep friends and in how

17 they function in society; and

WHEREAS, ADHD is a nondiscriminatory disorder affecting people of every age, gender, race, IQ, religion and socioeconomic background; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of October 2014 as "Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
