## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of October 19 through 26, 2014, as "Homeless Children's Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Homeless Children's Awareness Week will bring
- 4 attention to the growing problems and issues children
- 5 experiencing homelessness face throughout this Commonwealth and
- 6 across the nation; and
- 7 WHEREAS, According to the United States Department of Housing
- 8 and Urban Development, children comprised nearly one-quarter of
- 9 the total 610,000 Americans who were homeless on any given day
- 10 in 2013; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act states
- 12 that children are homeless if they lack a fixed, regular and
- 13 adequate nighttime residence; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Homelessness negatively impacts children's physical
- 15 health, emotional and behavioral development and academic
- 16 success; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Children are the fastest-growing segment of the
- 2 homeless population; and
- 3 WHEREAS, During the 2013-2014 school year, more than 19,000
- 4 school age children and youth were reported as experiencing
- 5 homelessness, which made up about 1% of the total Pennsylvania
- 6 public school enrollment population for that year; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Youth experiencing homelessness face several
- 8 obstacles, including frequent moves which disrupt their
- 9 education, making them twice as likely to repeat a grade; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The National Coalition for the Homeless cites
- 11 studies that show youth experiencing homelessness are set back
- 12 academically three to six months; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The national school dropout rate for children facing
- 14 homelessness is 60% higher than for a child who does not have
- 15 that experience during the school year; and
- 16 WHEREAS, For more than 15 years, the Homeless Children's
- 17 Education Fund has been working to increase educational
- 18 opportunities for children and youth experiencing homelessness
- 19 in Allegheny County in an effort to combat such statistics; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Many events will take place during Homeless
- 21 Children's Awareness Week in Pittsburgh, including an intimate
- 22 storytelling event, a performance art installation and a 5k and
- 23 10k run/walk to raise awareness about children experiencing
- 24 homelessness; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Individuals and groups across this Commonwealth are
- 26 encouraged to create their own events during Homeless Children's
- 27 Awareness Week to raise awareness about the needs and challenges
- 28 of children and youth experiencing homelessness in this
- 29 Commonwealth; therefore be it
- 30 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of October 19

- 1 through 26, 2014, as "Homeless Children's Awareness Week" in
- 2 Pennsylvania.
