## A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing Rolling Thunder Incorporated's effort to prominently place a prisoners of war/missing in action chair of honor in
- the Main Capitol Rotunda area during the days surrounding
- 4 National POW/MIA Recognition Day and Veteran's Day.
- 5 WHEREAS, The history of our nation was built upon the
- 6 triumphs, struggles and sacrifices of the many men and women who
- 7 have endured battle and hardship in defense of our nation's
- 8 security and freedom; and
- 9 WHEREAS, We support our soldiers in times of both war and
- 10 peace and look forward to their safe return; and
- 11 WHEREAS, There remains, however, a group of these dedicated
- 12 men and women, our prisoners of war/missing in action
- 13 (POW/MIAs), who have never returned home, whose sacrifices and
- 14 ordeals will never be known and whose bravery will never be
- 15 forgotten; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Rolling Thunder Incorporated's major mission is to
- 17 publicize the issues surrounding POW/MIAs and to educate the
- 18 public concerning the many American prisoners of war who were

- 1 left behind after past wars; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Rolling Thunder Incorporated also seeks to help
- 3 correct the past and protect future veterans from being left
- 4 behind should they become POW/MIAs; and
- 5 WHEREAS, While we look forward to the return of our troops
- 6 currently serving overseas and hope for their safety, we must
- 7 also remember and pay tribute to the more than 91,000 servicemen
- 8 and women who are unaccounted for from the wars and armed
- 9 conflicts the United States has been involved in since World War
- 10 I; and
- 11 WHEREAS, In recent years, commemorative chairs honoring
- 12 American POW/MIAs have been placed in prominent locations across
- 13 the United States, such as at sporting event stadiums, motor
- 14 speedways and county and local government centers; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Rolling Thunder Incorporated's dedicated efforts
- 16 have resulted in over two hundred chairs being placed in less
- 17 than 18 months; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The Capitol Complex is an appropriate location to
- 19 place a commemorative chair honoring American POW/MIAs; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Veterans, their families and our communities and
- 21 nation should strive to find a renewed commitment to the ideals
- 22 for which veterans fought and the strength, unity and resolve to
- 23 uphold their mission today and throughout the year; therefore be
