

2024 South Dakota Legislature Senate Bill 181

Introduced by: Senator Tobin

1 An Act to specify work search requirements for unemployment benefits.

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

3 Section 1. That § 61-6-1 be AMENDED:

- 4 61-6-1. An unemployed individual is eligible to receive benefits with respect to
 any week only if the department finds that:
- 6 (1)The individual has registered for work at and thereafter has continued to report at 7 an employment office in accordance with rules promulgated by the department 8 pursuant to chapter 1-26. However, that the The department may, by rule, waive 9 or alter either or both of the requirements of this subdivision as to individuals 10 attached to regular jobs and as to-such other types of cases or situations-with 11 respect to which where the department finds that compliance with the 12 requirements would be oppressive, or would be inconsistent with the purposes of 13 this title. No-such rule may conflict with this chapter;
- 14 (2) The individual has made a claim for benefits in accordance with the provisions of
 15 § 61-7-1;
- 16 (3) The individual is able to work and is available for work, and has completed no fewer 17 than five work search actions, as provided in section 2 of this Act, per week, that 18 are reported weekly to the department, in accordance with rules promulgated by 19 the department pursuant to chapter 1-26;
- 20 (4) Prior to any week for which the individual claims benefits, the individual has been
 21 unemployed for a waiting period of one week; and
- (5) The individual has, during the individual's base period, earned wages for insured
 work equal to <u>or</u> not less than the minimum amount required for benefit
 entitlement in § 61-6-4.

25 Section 2. That a NEW SECTION be added to chapter 61-6:

1	An action is an acceptable work search action in compliance with the requirement
2	of subdivision 61-6-1(3) if it consists of one or more of the following actions in any week,
3	except that in the third week of benefit eligibility and during every subsequent week, at
4	least four of the five required work search actions must be actions provided in subdivisions
5	7 to 10 of this section:
6	(1) Completing an online or in-person job search workshop;
7	(2) Completing a job search assessment, including a personality, skills, or interests
8	assessment;
9	(3) Completing career direction research or work;
10	(4) Completing job search branding and marketing activities;
11	(5) Completing an online or in-person mock interview;
12	(6) Taking a civil service exam;
13	(7) Submitting a resume to an employer;
14	(8) Completing and submitting a job application to an employer;
15	(9) Attending and completing an interview or skills test with an employer; and
16	(10) Attending a job fair.
