Mr. MARKEY introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

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## A BILL

To prohibit certain transfers of radioactive metal by the Department of Energy, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Ban All Radioactive  
5 Recycling Act of 2013”.

6 **SEC. 2. RADIOACTIVE METAL.**

7 (a) AMENDMENT.—Subtitle D of title I of the Nu-  
8 clear Waste Policy Act of 1982 (42 U.S.C. 10171) is  
9 amended by adding at the end the following new section:

1 “RADIOACTIVE METAL

2 “SEC. 152. (a) PROHIBITION.—The Department of  
3 Energy shall not plan or undertake sales, trades, barter,  
4 or transfers of any metal that has been used or stored  
5 in a radiological area other than for the purposes of stor-  
6 age pursuant to subsection (b).

7 “(b) STORAGE.—Such metal shall, when removed  
8 from the radiological area in which it was used or stored,  
9 be stored or disposed of at a site—

10 “(1) specifically licensed by the Commission for  
11 the storage or disposal of radioactive waste;

12 “(2) specifically licensed by a State pursuant to  
13 section 274 of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 (42  
14 U.S.C. 2021) for the storage or disposal of radio-  
15 active waste; or

16 “(3) at a site on property owned by the Depart-  
17 ment of Energy that has been approved by the Sec-  
18 retary for the storage or disposal of radioactive  
19 waste.”.

20 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—The table of con-  
21 tents of the Nuclear Waste Policy Act of 1982 is amended  
22 by adding after the item relating to section 151 the fol-  
23 lowing new item:

“Sec. 152. Radioactive metal.”.

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
