A BILL

To prohibit Federal funding of foreign travel by the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency until the Agency conducts public listening sessions on rulemaking targeting carbon dioxide emissions from existing power plants in each of the 15 States with the highest percentage of electricity generated by coal in 2012.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Listen to Americans
3 First Act of 2013”.

4 **SEC. 2. NO FOREIGN TRAVEL UNTIL PUBLIC LISTENING**
5 **SESSIONS ARE CONDUCTED IN STATES THAT**
6 **RELY ON COAL.**

7 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no Fed-
8 eral funds may be obligated or expended for any travel
9 outside of the United States or its territories by the Ad-
10 ministrator of the Environmental Protection Agency
11 until—

12 (1) the Environmental Protection Agency con-
13 ducts public listening sessions on rulemaking tar-
14 geting carbon dioxide emissions from existing power
15 plants in each of the 15 States with the highest per-
16 centage of electricity generated by coal in 2012
17 (West Virginia, Kentucky, Wyoming, Indiana, Mis-
18 souri, North Dakota, Utah, Nebraska, New Mexico,
19 Ohio, Colorado, Kansas, Iowa, Montana, and Wis-
20 consin); and

21 (2) the Administrator of the Environmental
22 Protection Agency certifies to the chairman and
23 ranking member of the Committee on Energy and
24 Commerce of the House of Representatives and the
25 chairman and ranking member of the Committee on
26 Environment and Public Works of the Senate that

1 the 15 public listening sessions described in para-
2 graph (1) have taken place.

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
