AN ACT

To provide for identifying and eliminating redundant reporting requirements and developing meaningful performance metrics for homeland security preparedness grants, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Redundancy Elimi-
- 5 nation and Enhanced Performance for Preparedness
- 6 Grants Act".

1	SEC. 2. IDENTIFICATION OF REPORTING REDUNDANCIES
2	AND DEVELOPMENT OF PERFORMANCE
3	METRICS FOR HOMELAND SECURITY PRE-
4	PAREDNESS GRANT PROGRAMS.
5	(a) IN GENERAL.—Title XX of the Homeland Secu-
6	rity Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 601 et seq.) is amended by
7	adding at the end the following new section:
8	"SEC. 2023. IDENTIFICATION OF REPORTING
9	REDUNDANCIES AND DEVELOPMENT OF PER
10	FORMANCE METRICS.
11	"(a) In General.—The Administrator shall, for
12	grants under sections 2003 and 2004 and any other
13	grants specified by the Administrator, submit a report to
14	the appropriate committees of Congress by not later than
15	120 days after the date of the enactment of the Redun-
16	dancy Elimination and Enhanced Performance for Pre-
17	paredness Grants Act, and by October 1st every 2 years
18	thereafter, that—
19	"(1) identifies redundant rules, regulations, and
20	requirements for reporting by recipients of such
21	grants, and includes a plan for eliminating such
22	identified redundancies and requirements;
23	"(2) includes a plan for developing and improv-
24	ing the performance metrics required under section
2.5	2022(a)(4) for such grants, and

1	"(3) includes an assessment of each program
2	under which such grants are awarded.
3	"(b) Plan Requirements.—Each plan under sub-
4	section (a)—
5	"(1) shall be developed in coordination with
6	State, local, tribal, and territorial governments; and
7	"(2) shall include a proposed timeline for ac-
8	tions to implement the plan.
9	"(c) Program Assessment Requirements.—Each
10	program assessment under subsection (a)(3) shall in-
11	elude—
12	"(1) a brief summary of the program purposes,
13	objectives, and performance goals, and of the key
14	findings of the assessment;
15	$\frac{\text{``(2)}}{\text{an assessment of the quality of the pro-}}$
16	gram's performance metrics, and the extent to which
17	necessary performance data are collected;
18	"(3) a summary of how the program's strengths
19	and weaknesses are impeding or contributing to its
20	failures or successes, including reasons for any sub-
21	stantial variation from the targeted level of perform-
22	ance of the program;
23	"(4) a description of the extent to which any
24	trends, developments, or emerging conditions affect

- the need to change the mission of the program or
 the way that the program is being carried out;
- 3 "(5) an identification of the best practices used
 4 in the program for allocating resources in an effi5 cient and effective manner that resulted in positive
 6 outcomes and the key reasons why such practices re7 sulted in positive outcomes;
- 8 "(6) recommendations for program modifica-9 tions to improve the results that the program 10 achieves;
 - "(7) a summary of key results of the program assessment that support maximizing the amount of funds appropriated for the program; and
- 14 "(8) an assessment of the quality of customer 15 service offered to recipients of funds under the pro-16 gram and a strategy for improving such service.".
- 17 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of contents
 18 in section 1(b) of such Act is amended by adding at the
 19 end of the items relating to title XX the following new

5	(a) In General.—Title XX of the Homeland Security
6	Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 601 et seq.) is amended by adding
7	at the end the following:
8	"SEC. 2023. IDENTIFICATION OF REPORTING
9	REDUNDANCIES AND DEVELOPMENT OF PER-
10	FORMANCE METRICS.
11	"(a) Definition.—In this section, the term 'covered
12	grants' means grants awarded under section 2003, grants
13	awarded under section 2004, and any other grants specified
14	by the Administrator.
15	"(b) Initial Report.—Not later than 90 days after
16	the date of enactment of the Redundancy Elimination and
17	Enhanced Performance for Preparedness Grants Act, the
18	Administrator shall submit to the appropriate committees
19	of Congress a report that includes—
20	"(1) an assessment of redundant reporting re-
21	quirements imposed by the Administrator on State,
22	local, and tribal governments in connection with the
23	awarding of grants, including—
24	"(A) a list of each discrete item of data re-
25	quested by the Administrator from grant recipi-

1	ents as part of the process of administering cov-
2	ered grants;
3	"(B) identification of the items of data from
4	the list described in subparagraph (A) that are
5	required to be submitted by grant recipients on
6	multiple occasions or to multiple systems; and
7	"(C) identification of the items of data from
8	the list described in subparagraph (A) that are
9	not necessary to be collected in order for the Ad-
10	ministrator to effectively and efficiently admin-
11	ister the programs under which covered grants
12	$are \ awarded;$
13	"(2) a plan, including a specific timetable, for
14	eliminating any redundant and unnecessary report-
15	ing requirements identified under paragraph (1); and
16	"(3) a plan, including a specific timetable, for
17	promptly developing a set of quantifiable performance
18	measures and metrics to assess the effectiveness of the
19	programs under which covered grants are awarded.
20	"(c) Biennial Reports.—Not later than 1 year after
21	the date on which the initial report is required to be sub-
22	mitted under subsection (b), and once every 2 years there-
23	after, the Administrator shall submit to the appropriate
24	committees of Congress a grants management report that
25	includes—

1	"(1) the status of efforts to eliminate redundant
2	and unnecessary reporting requirements imposed on
3	grant recipients, including—
4	"(A) progress made in implementing the
5	$plan\ required\ under\ subsection\ (b)(2);$
6	"(B) a reassessment of the reporting re-
7	quirements to identify and eliminate redundant
8	and unnecessary requirements;
9	"(2) the status of efforts to develop quantifiable
10	performance measures and metrics to assess the effec-
11	tiveness of the programs under which the covered
12	grants are awarded, including—
13	"(A) progress made in implementing the
14	$plan\ required\ under\ subsection\ (b)(3);$
15	"(B) progress made in developing and im-
16	plementing additional performance metrics and
17	measures for grants, including as part of the
18	comprehensive assessment system required under
19	section 649 of the Post-Katrina Emergency Man-
20	agement Reform Act of 2006 (6 U.S.C. 749); and
21	"(3) a performance assessment of each program
22	under which the covered grants are awarded, includ-
23	ing—
24	"(A) a description of the objectives and
25	goals of the program;

1	"(B) an assessment of the extent to which
2	the objectives and goals described in subpara-
3	graph (A) have been met, based on the quantifi-
4	able performance measures and metrics required
5	under this section, section 2022(a)(4), and sec-
6	tion 649 of the Post-Katrina Emergency Man-
7	agement Reform Act of 2006 (6 U.S.C. 749);
8	"(C) recommendations for any program

- "(C) recommendations for any program modifications to improve the effectiveness of the program, to address changed or emerging conditions; and
- "(D) an assessment of the experience of recipients of covered grants, including the availability of clear and accurate information, the timeliness of reviews and awards, and the provision of technical assistance, and recommendations for improving that experience.

"(d) Grants Program Measurement Study.—

"(1) In General.—Not later than 30 days after the enactment of Redundancy Elimination and Enhanced Performance for Preparedness Grants Act, the Administrator shall enter into a contract with the National Academy of Public Administration under which the National Academy of Public Administra-

1	tion shall assist the Administrator in studying, devel-
2	oping, and implementing—
3	"(A) quantifiable performance measures
4	and metrics to assess the effectiveness of grants
5	administered by the Department, as required
6	under this section and section 649 of the Post-
7	Katrina Emergency Management Reform Act of
8	2006 (6 U.S.C. 749); and
9	"(B) the plan required under subsection
10	(b)(3).
11	"(2) Report.—Not later than 1 year after the
12	date on which the contract described in paragraph (1)
13	is awarded, the Administrator shall submit to the ap-
14	propriate committees of Congress a report that de-
15	scribes the findings and recommendations of the study
16	conducted under paragraph (1).
17	"(3) Authorization of Appropriations.—
18	There are authorized to be appropriated to the Ad-
19	ministrator such sums as may be necessary to carry
20	out this subsection.".
21	(b) Technical and Conforming Amendment.—The
22	table of contents in section 1(b) of the Homeland Security
23	Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 101 et seq.) is amended by adding
24	at the end the following:

"Sec. 2023. Identification of reporting redundancies and development of performance metrics.".
