A BILL

To designate Indigenous Peoples' Day as a legal public holiday and replace the term "Columbus Day" with the term "Indigenous Peoples' Day", and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the "Indigenous Peoples'
5 Day Act".

1 **SEC. 2. INDIGENOUS PEOPLES' DAY AS A LEGAL PUBLIC**
2 **HOLIDAY.**

3 Section 6103(a) of title 5, United States Code, is
4 amended by striking the item relating to Columbus Day
5 and inserting the following:

6 "Indigenous Peoples' Day, the second Monday
7 in October."

8 **SEC. 3. TERM "COLUMBUS DAY" REPLACED.**

9 Any reference to "Columbus Day" in any law, rule,
10 regulation, or other official paper in effect as of the date
11 of the enactment of this Act shall be deemed to be a ref-
12 erence to "Indigenous Peoples' Day".
