Mr. CARTWRIGHT (for himself, Mr. NUNN of Iowa, Ms. MOORE of Wisconsin, Mr. MORELLE, Mr. MULLIN, Mr. TRONE, and Ms. TOKUDA) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Education and the Workforce

A BILL

To strengthen Federal data collection regarding the teacher and principal workforce.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Strengthening Educa-
5 tor Workforce Data Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. CIVIL RIGHTS DATA COLLECTION ON THE EDUCA-**

7 **TOR WORKFORCE.**

8 (a) **MANDATORY EDUCATOR WORKFORCE DATA**
9 **COLLECTION.**—In carrying out the civil rights data collec-

1 tion required under section 203(c)(1) of the Department
2 of Education Organization Act (20 U.S.C. 3413(c)(1)),
3 the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights of the Department
4 shall, as part of the data collection, collect and publish
5 the data described in subsection (b) on the educator work-
6 force with respect to teachers and principals.

7 (b) METRICS.—

8 (1) IN GENERAL.—A civil rights data collection
9 described in subsection (a) shall include the fol-
10 lowing metrics from each local educational agency
11 and public elementary school or secondary school
12 that is required to respond to such data collection:

13 (A) PRINCIPAL DATA.—For each local edu-
14 cational agency, the following data regarding
15 principals employed at public elementary
16 schools and secondary schools served by the
17 local educational agency:

18 (i) The number of full-time principals
19 employed.

20 (ii) Including the year of the data col-
21 lection—

22 (I) the median number of years
23 of principal experience of full-time
24 principals employed; and

(II) the years of experience of the full-time principals employed, based on the following categories:

(aa) Less than 1 year of principal experience.

(bb) At least 1 year but less than 3 years of principal experience.

(cc) At least 3 years but less than 7 years of principal experience.

(dd) At least 7 years but less than 15 years of principal experience

(ee) 15 or more years of principal experience.

CHER DATA.—For each local edu-

(ii) Including the year of the data col-

lection, but excluding student teaching and

similar teaching preparation experiences—

(I) the median number of years

of teaching experience of full-time

the following categories:

(aa) Less than 1 year of

teaching experience.

(bb) At least 1 year but less

than 2 years of teaching experi-

ence.

(cc) At least 2 years but less

than 5 years of teaching experi-

ence.

(dd) At least 5 years but

less than 10 years of teaching ex-

perience.

(ee) At least 10 years but

less than 20 years of teaching ex-

perience.

(ff) 20 or more years of

teaching experience.

(iii) The number of full-time teachers employed who meet all State licensing and certification requirements.

(iv) The number of full-time teachers employed who do not meet all State licensing and certification requirements.

(v) The numbers of full-time teachers employed who meet all State license, certificate, and endorsement requirements in each of the following:

(I) Mathematics.

(II) Science.

(III) English as a second lan-

guage.

(IV) Special education.

23 (c) REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.—

(1) SPECIAL REPORT.—Upon the conclusion of each civil rights data collection that includes the

1 data required under subsection (b), the Secretary,
2 acting through the Assistant Secretary for Civil
3 Rights of the Department, shall prepare a special re-
4 port regarding the educator workforce.

5 (2) CONTENTS.—The report required under
6 paragraph (1) shall—

7 (A) be accessible through the website of
8 the Office for Civil Rights of the Department;

9 (B) include information on—

10 (i) for each State, the total number of
11 principals in the educator workforce, as
12 calculated in the most recent civil rights
13 data collection that includes the data re-
14 quired under subsection (b), based on a
15 summary of the data collected in accord-
16 ance with this section; and

17 (ii) for each State, the total number
18 of teachers in the educator workforce, as
19 calculated in such data collection, based on
20 a summary of the data collected in accord-
21 ance with this section; and

22 (C) for each category described in subpara-
23 graph (B), present in an easily accessible man-
24 ner, such as through percentages or a graph or
25 other visual representation, the—

12 (d) DATA PRIVACY.—In carrying out data collection,
13 disaggregation, cross-tabulation, and reporting in accord-
14 ance with this section and under section 203(c)(1) of the
15 Department of Education Organization Act (20 U.S.C.
16 3413(c)(1)), the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights of
17 the Department shall coordinate with the Chief Privacy
18 Officer of the Department to ensure that teacher and prin-
19 cipal privacy is protected and that individually identifiable
20 information about teachers and principals remains con-
21 fidential.

22 (e) **DEFINITIONS.**—In this section:

1 meanings given such terms in section 8101 of the
2 Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965
3 (20 U.S.C. 7801).

4 (2) TEACHER.—The term “teacher” means an
5 individual employed as a teacher, including a pre-
6 school teacher, at a public elementary school or sec-
7 ondary school.

8 (f) APPLICABILITY.—This section shall apply with re-
9 spect to each civil rights data collection required under
10 section 203(c)(1) of the Department of Education Organi-
11 zation Act that begins on or after the date of enactment
12 of this Act.
