AN ACT

To reauthorize the Project Safe Neighborhoods Grant Program Authorization Act of 2018, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Project Safe Neighbor-3 hoods Reauthorization Act of 2023".

4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

- 5 Congress finds the following:
- 6 (1) Launched in 2001, the Project Safe Neigh-7 borhoods program is a nationwide initiative that 8 brings together Federal, State, local, and Tribal law 9 enforcement officials, prosecutors, community lead-10 ers, and other stakeholders to identify the most 11 pressing crime problems in a community and work 12 collaboratively to address those problems.
- 13 (2) The Project Safe Neighborhoods program—
 14 (A) operates in all 94 Federal judicial dis15 tricts throughout the 50 States and territories
 16 of the United States; and
- 17 (B) implements 4 key components to successfully reduce violent crime in communities,
 19 including community engagement, prevention
 20 and intervention, focused and strategic enforce21 ment, and accountability.

22 SEC. 3. REAUTHORIZATION.

(a) DEFINITIONS.—Section 2 of the Project Safe
Neighborhoods Grant Program Authorization Act of 2018
(34 U.S.C. 60701) is amended—

1	(1) by redesignating paragraphs (1) , (2) , and
2	(3) as paragraphs (2), (4), and (5), respectively;
3	(2) by inserting before paragraph (2), as so re-
4	designated, the following:
5	((1) the term 'crime analyst' means an indi-
6	vidual employed by a law enforcement agency for the
7	purpose of separating information into key compo-
8	nents and contributing to plans of action to under-
9	stand, mitigate, and neutralize criminal threats;";
10	and
11	(3) by inserting after paragraph (2), as so re-
12	designated, the following:
13	"(3) the term 'law enforcement assistant'
14	means an individual employed by a law enforcement
15	agency or a prosecuting agency for the purpose of
16	aiding law enforcement officers in investigative or
17	administrative duties;".
18	(b) USE OF FUNDS.—Section 4(b) of the Project
19	Safe Neighborhoods Grant Program Authorization Act of
20	2018 (34 U.S.C. 60703(b)) is amended—
21	(1) in paragraph (3), by striking "or" at the
22	end;
23	(2) in paragraph (4) , by striking the period at
24	the end and inserting a semicolon; and
25	(3) by adding at the end the following:

1 "(5) hiring crime analysts to assist with violent 2 crime reduction efforts; 3 "(6) the cost of overtime for law enforcement 4 officers, prosecutors, and law enforcement assistants 5 that assist with the Program; and 6 "(7) purchasing, implementing, and using tech-7 nology to assist with violent crime reduction ef-8 forts.". 9 (c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—Section 10 6 of the Project Safe Neighborhoods Grant Program Authorization Act of 2018 (34 U.S.C. 60705) is amended 11 by striking "fiscal years 2019 through 2021" and insert-12 ing "fiscal years 2024 through 2028". 13 SEC. 4. TASK FORCE SUPPORT. 14 15 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This section may be cited as the 16 "Officer Ella Grace French and Sergeant Jim Smith Task Force Support Act of 2023". 17 18 (b) AMENDMENT.—Section 4(b) of the Project Safe 19 Neighborhoods Grant Program Authorization Act of 2018 20 (34 U.S.C. 60703(b)), as amended by section 3(b), is 21 amended-(1) in paragraph (6), by striking "and" at the 22 23 end; 24 (2) in paragraph (7), by striking the period at the end and inserting "; and"; and 25

(3) by adding at the end the following:
 "(8) support for multi-jurisdictional task
 forces.".

4 SEC. 5. TRANSPARENCY.

5 Not less frequently than annually, the Attorney Gen-6 eral shall submit to the Committee on the Judiciary of 7 the Senate and the Committee on the Judiciary of the 8 House of Representatives a report that details, for each 9 area in which the Project Safe Neighborhoods Block 10 Grant Program operates and with respect to the 1-year 11 period preceding the date of the report—

12 (1) how the area spent funds under the Project13 Safe Neighborhoods Block Grant Program;

14 (2) the community outreach efforts performed15 in the area; and

(3) the number and a description of the violent
crime offenses committed in the area, including murder, non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, and
aggravated assault.
