Authorizing expenditures by the Special Committee on Aging.

Mr. NELSON, from the Special Committee on Aging, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Special Committee on Aging.

1 *Resolved,*

2 **SECTION 1. GENERAL AUTHORITY.**

3 In carrying out its powers, duties, and functions im-
4 posed by section 104 of S. Res. 4, agreed to February
5 4, 1977 (95th Congress), and in exercising the authority
6 conferred on it by such section, the Special Committee on
7 Aging (in this resolution referred to as the “committee”)
8 is authorized from October 1, 2013, through September
9 30, 2014, and October 1, 2014, through February 28,
10 2015, in its discretion to—

1 (1) make expenditures from the contingent fund
2 of the Senate;

3 (2) employ personnel; and

4 (3) with the prior consent of the Government
5 department or agency concerned and the Committee
6 on Rules and Administration, use on a reimbursable
7 or nonreimbursable basis the services of personnel of
8 any such department or agency.

9 **SEC. 2. EXPENSES.**

10 (a) PERIOD ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2014.—The ex-
11 penses of the committee for the period October 1, 2013,
12 through September 30, 2014, under this resolution shall
13 not exceed \$2,375,377, of which amount, not to exceed
14 \$10,000 may be expended for the training of the profes-
15 sional staff of the committee (under procedures specified
16 by section 202(j) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of
17 1946 (2 U.S.C. 72a(j))).

18 (b) PERIOD ENDING FEBRUARY 28, 2015.—The ex-
19 penses of the committee for the period October 1, 2014,
20 through February 28, 2015, under this resolution shall
21 not exceed \$989,740, of which amount, not to exceed
22 \$4,000 may be expended for the training of the profes-
23 sional staff of the committee (under procedures specified
24 by section 202(j) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of
25 1946 (2 U.S.C. 72a(j))).

1 **SEC. 3. REPORTING LEGISLATION.**

2 The committee shall report its findings, together with
3 such recommendations for legislation as it deems advis-
4 able, to the Senate at the earliest practicable date, but
5 not later than February 28, 2015.

6 **SEC. 4. EXPENSES AND AGENCY CONTRIBUTIONS.**

7 (a) EXPENSES OF THE COMMITTEE.—

8 (1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in para-
9 graph (2), expenses of the committee under this res-
10 olution shall be paid from the contingent fund of the
11 Senate upon vouchers approved by the chairman of
12 the committee.

13 (2) VOUCHERS NOT REQUIRED.—Vouchers shall
14 not be required for—

15 (A) the disbursement of salaries of employ-
16 ees paid at an annual rate;

17 (B) the payment of telecommunications
18 provided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms
19 and Doorkeeper;

20 (C) the payment of stationery supplies pur-
21 chased through the Keeper of the Stationery;

22 (D) payments to the Postmaster of the
23 Senate;

24 (E) the payment of metered charges on
25 copying equipment provided by the Office of the
26 Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper;

1 (F) the payment of Senate Recording and
2 Photographic Services; or

3 (G) the payment of franked and mass mail
4 costs by the Sergeant at Arms and Doorkeeper,
5 United States Senate.

6 (b) AGENCY CONTRIBUTIONS.—There are authorized
7 such sums as may be necessary for agency contributions
8 related to the compensation of employees of the committee
9 from October 1, 2013, through September 30, 2014, and
10 October 1, 2014, through February 28, 2015, to be paid
11 from the appropriations account for “Expenses of Inquir-
12 ies and Investigations” of the Senate.

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
