- (1) (a) It is unlawful for [any] a person to use, or to possess with intent to use, drug paraphernalia to plant, propagate, cultivate, grow, harvest, manufacture, compound, convert, produce, process, prepare, test, analyze, pack, repack, store, contain, conceal, inject, ingest, inhale or otherwise introduce a controlled substance into the

(b) [Any] A person who violates Subsection (1)(a) is guilty of a class B misdemeanor. 28

29	(2)	(a) It is unlawful for [any] a person to deliver, possess with intent to deliver, or
30		manufacture with intent to deliver, any drug paraphernalia, knowing that the drug
31		paraphernalia will be used to plant, propagate, cultivate, grow, harvest, manufacture,
32		compound, convert, produce, process, prepare, test, analyze, pack, repack, store,
33		contain, conceal, inject, ingest, inhale, or otherwise introduce a controlled substance
34		into the human body in violation of this act.

18		(b) A person may not be charged with possession of <u>a</u> hypodermic [syringes] syringe as
19		drug paraphernalia if the syringe is unused and is in a sealed sterile package.
50	<u>(6)</u>	In a prosecution under Subsection (1) for possession of a hypodermic syringe or needle,
51		the prosecutor or the court may dismiss the charge if the person establishes, by a
52		preponderance of the evidence, that:

54		(i) the hypodermic syringe or needle was stored in a sealed puncture-resistant
55		container, such as a medical sharps disposal container, that was clearly marked on
56		the outside of the container with a warning that identified the container as
57		containing medical waste; and
58		(ii) the person was enrolled or participating in a syringe exchange program under
59		Section 26B-7-117; and
50		(b) after the day of the offense, but before the day on which the case is adjudicated, the
51		person demonstrated an intent to engage with substance abuse treatment by
52		commencing, continuing, or completing a substance use disorder treatment program.
