31A-22-660 . Definitions -- Prohibitions concerning organ harvesting --24

Section 1. Section 31A-22-660 is enacted to read:

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- 26 (1) As used in this section, "forced organ harvesting" means the removal of one or more
- organs from a living individual, or from an individual killed for the purpose of removal 27

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28	of one or more of the individual's organs, by means of coercion, abduction, deception,
29	fraud, or abuse of power or a position of vulnerability.
30	(2) An issuer of accident and health insurance may not cover a human organ transplant or
31	post-transplant care if:
32	(a) the human organ transplant operation is performed in the People's Republic of China
33	or any other country known to have participated in forced organ harvesting, as
34	designated pursuant to Subsection (3); or
35	(b) the human organ to be transplanted was procured by sale or donation originating in
36	the People's Republic of China or any other country known to have participated in
37	forced organ harvesting, as designated pursuant to Subsection (3).
