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2	This article is known and may be cited as the "Wyoming
3	Traditional Food Act."
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5	35-7-1702. Definitions.
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7	(a) As used in this article:
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9	(i) "Traditional event or activity" means an
10	occasion where potentially hazardous and not potentially
11	hazardous foods have traditionally been, and are presently,
12	stored and prepared in a private home or a place other than
13	an establishment, which is equipped for the storage and
14	preparation of food for consumption or use in conducting
15	traditional activities, including but not limited to the
16	preparation of food:
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18	(A) For family and nonpaying guests;
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20	(B) For weddings, funerals, potluck dinners

21 or functions as defined in W.S. 35-7-110(a)(xxix);
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(C) For the sales of donated foods which 1 2 are prepared for consumption and the sales are sponsored by 3 a nonprofit entity as a fundraiser to support its purposes; 4 5 (D) For outdoor activities such as picnics, barbeques, roundups, camping or outdoor work conducted by 6 employees or volunteers; 7 8 9 (E) By utilizing kitchen equipment provided convenience for the storage 10 employers as a 11 preparation of foods for consumption on the premises by employees and nonpaying quests. 12 13 35-7-1703. Wyoming Traditional Food Act; purpose. 14 15 Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, there shall be 16 17 licensure, permitting, certification, inspection, packaging or labeling required by any state governmental 18 agency or any agency of any political subdivision of the 19 20 state which pertains to the preparation, serving, use, 21 consumption or storage of foods at a traditional event or 22 activity.

W.S. 35-7-110(a)(xi), 35-7-119 by creating 1 a new subsection (f), 35-7-121 by creating a new subsection 2 3 (h) and 35-7-124 by creating a new subsection (g) are 4 amended to read: 5 35-7-110. Definitions. 6 7 (a) As used in this act: 8 9 (xi) "Establishment" means and includes 10 place or any area of any establishment in which foods, 11 drugs, devices and cosmetics are displayed for sale, 12 13 manufactured, processed, packed, held or 14 "Establishment" does not include a home kitchen where food is prepared and stored for family consumption, or any other 15 place equipped for the preparation, consumption and storage 16 17 of food on the premise by employees or nonpaying guests; 18 35-7-119. Fair packaging and labeling provisions. 19 20 21 (f) Subsections (a) and (c) of this section shall not 22 apply to the preparation, service, use, consumption or storage of foods at a traditional event or activity 23
