A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to pubic health and safety; prescribing the
- 2 governor's authority and duties if a health care facility
- 3 is determined to be in financial crisis, as specified;
- 4 prescribing the state's and governor's objectives;
- 5 providing for transfer of appropriated funds as specified;
- 6 providing for loans by the state loan and investment board;
- 7 providing an appropriation; and providing for an effective
- 8 date.

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10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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12 **Section 1.** W.S. 35-2-1001 is created to read:

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- 14 ARTICLE 10
- 15 HEALTH CARE FACILITIES CRISIS MANAGEMENT

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35-2-1001. Health care facility crisis; governor's action.

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5 (a) When the governor learns or is advised by the director of the department of health that a facility caring 6 for persons who are recipients of Medicaid or other means 7 tested government programs for the necessary support of the 8 9 poor is in imminent danger of being unable to meet its current financial obligations and continue its operations, 10 11 he may, if he believes the clients of the facility may not be able to receive adequate care or the situation may cause 12 13 a public health emergency:

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15 (i) Insist on local and community support in 16 helping to resolve the crisis;

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18 (ii) Loan state funds to the trustees in 19 bankruptcy for the facility in crisis or the debtor in 20 possession in bankruptcy to either:

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(A) Facilitate the orderly liquidation of the facility, ensuring proper care for the facility's clients during the liquidation process;

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2 (B) Facilitate the reorganization of the 3 facility for its continued operation pursuant to federal

4 bankruptcy law.

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6 (iii) Order Medicaid or other state programs to
7 pay the full cost of any service received from the facility
8 including a reasonable allowance for debt service on any
9 loan from the state or other organization. For Medicaid
10 this payment shall not be in excess of the facility's full
11 cost based on cost reports submitted to the department of

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health;

14 (iv) Order Medicaid or other state programs to
15 pay more promptly for recipient's services.

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17 (b) For any loan pursuant to subsection (a) of this governor shall determine the source of 18 section, the appropriated funds to be used. The governor is specifically 19 20 authorized to use for this purpose the funds in the 21 Medicaid contingency reserve created by Wyoming Session 22 Laws 2010, Ch. 39, section 306 or the health care financing line item of the department of health budget. 23

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(c) The objectives of the state and the governor in 1 2 implementing this section shall be: 3 4 (i) To ensure adequate care for all those 5 persons cared for by the facility in crisis and to protect their lives and health; 6 7 (ii) To protect the public health from the 8 difficulties caused 9 for other health care systems, facilities and institutions if they suddenly have to care 10 for the individuals who have been cared for by the facility 11 in crisis; 12 13 To ensure the ongoing effective operation 14 (iii) of the state's programs for the necessary support of the 15 poor affected by the situation; and 16 17 (iv) To protect the financial interests of the 18 19 state. 20 21 Section 2. There is appropriated two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) from the general fund to the Medicaid 22

contingency reserve created by Wyoming Session Laws 2010,

Ch. 39, section 306. This appropriation shall be for the

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1 period beginning with the effective date of this act and

2 ending June 30, 2012. This appropriation shall only be

3 expended for the purpose of this act and for Medicaid

4 operating costs as provided in this act. Notwithstanding

5 any other provision of law, this appropriation shall not be

6 transferred or expended for any other purpose and any

7 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this

8 appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30,

9 2012. This appropriation shall not be included in the

10 governor's 2013-2014 standard biennial budget request.

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12 **Section 3.** This act is effective immediately upon

13 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

14 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

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15 Constitution.
