 shall adopt a policy entitling a [IN ADDITION, EACH] member of the legislature

 [IS ENTITLED] to an annual allowance [PRESCRIBED IN ACCORDANCE WITH
- 9 AS 39.23] for postage, stationery, stenographic services, and other expenses.
