FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

- "An Act relating to obstruction or interference with a person's free passage on or use of navigable water; and amending the definition of 'navigable water' under the Alaska
 Land Act."
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
- 5 * **Section 1.** AS 38.05.128(a) is amended to read: 6 (a) A person may not obstruct or interfere with the free passage or use by a 7 person of any navigable water unless the obstruction or interference is 8 (1) authorized by law or regulation or by a permit issued by a 9 [FEDERAL AGENCY AND A] state agency; 10 (2) [AUTHORIZED UNDER A FEDERAL OR STATE LAW OR PERMIT: 11 12 (3)] exempt under 33 U.S.C. 1344(f) (Clean Water Act); 13 (3) [(4)] caused by the normal operation of freight barging that is 14 otherwise consistent with law; or
