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## **AN ACT**

Establishing the Alaska task force for the regulation of psychedelic medicines approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration; and providing for an effective date.

## AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Alaska task force for the regulation of psychedelic medicines approved by
- 2 the United States Food and Drug Administration; and providing for an effective date.

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- \* Section 1. The uncodified law of the State of Alaska is amended by adding a new section to read:
- 6 ALASKA TASK FORCE FOR THE REGULATION OF PSYCHEDELIC
- 7 MEDICINES APPROVED BY THE UNITED STATES FOOD AND DRUG
- 8 ADMINISTRATION. (a) The Alaska task force for the regulation of psychedelic medicines
- 9 approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration is established in the legislature.
- 10 The purpose of the task force is to prepare for the potential medicalization of psychedelic
- 11 medicines by the United States Food and Drug Administration; to make policy
- 12 recommendations to the Alaska State Legislature concerning insurance and licensure, given
- 13 the unique nature of the administration of psychedelic medicines; and to ensure the state is

- 1 prepared if psychedelic medicines become available for prescription. The task force shall
- 2 (1) assess the potential use of psychedelic medicine in addressing the state's ongoing mental health crisis;
  - (2) consider barriers to implementation and equitable access;
- 5 (3) consider and recommend licensing and insurance requirements for 6 practitioners in the state in the event that psychedelic medicines are federally reclassified and 7 approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration; and
- 8 (4) consider legal and regulatory changes that could be necessary in the state 9 after federal medical approval of psychedelic medicines.
  - (b) The task force consists of the following members:
    - (1) the commissioner of health, or the commissioner's designee;
- 12 (2) the commissioner of military and veterans' affairs, or the commissioner's designee;
  - (3) the commissioner of commerce, community, and economic development, or the commissioner's designee;
  - (4) one member representing mental health issues in the state, selected by the state chapter of a national alliance focused on mental health and mental illness;
  - (5) two members representing the health care needs of Alaska Native communities, selected by the board of directors of the Alaska Native Health Board;
  - (6) one member representing the health care needs of survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault, selected by the Alaska Network on Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault;
  - (7) one member who is a physician or osteopath specializing in behavioral health, selected by the Board of Trustees of the Alaska State Medical Association;
  - (8) one member who is a physician or osteopath specializing in psychiatry, selected by the governing body of the Alaska Psychiatric Association;
  - (9) one member representing licensed therapists or counselors, selected by the board of directors of the Alaska Addiction Professionals Association;
- 29 (10) one member representing psychiatric nurse practitioners, selected by the 30 board of directors of the Alaska Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Alliance;
- 31 (11) one member who is a pharmacist, selected by the board of directors of the

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- 2 (12) one member of the senate appointed by the president of the senate;
- 3 (13) one member of the house of representatives appointed by the speaker of 4 the house of representatives;
- 5 (14) one member selected by the task force, once assembled, that the task 6 force determines would serve the purpose of the task force; the task force is not required to 7 make an appointment under this paragraph.
  - (c) The members appointed by the president of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives under (b)(12) and (13) of this section shall serve as co-chairs of the task force. A member appointed under (b)(12) or (13) of this section may select a designee to attend a meeting of the task force on the member's behalf.
  - (d) A vacancy on the task force shall be filled in the same manner as the original selection or appointment.
    - (e) Members of the task force serve without compensation.
  - (f) The task force shall
  - (1) meet at least four times, in person or through electronic means, to fulfill the purpose of the task force; and
    - (2) on or before January 31, 2025, submit to the senate secretary, the chief clerk of the house of representatives, and the governor a report consisting of its recommendations, and notify the legislature that the report is available.
    - (g) The task force terminates on the last day of the First Regular Session of the Thirty-Fourth Alaska State Legislature.
    - (h) In this section, "task force" means the Alaska task force for the regulation of psychedelic medicines approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration.
  - \* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect immediately under AS 01.10.070(c).
