# 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- **\* Section 1.** AS 46.03.476 is amended to read:
  - Sec. 46.03.476. Ocean <u>rangers</u> [RANGERS]. (a) An owner or operator of a large commercial passenger vessel entering the marine waters of the state is required to have (1) a marine engineer licensed by the United States Coast Guard <u>or (2) a person who holds a degree in marine safety and environmental protection, or an equivalent course of study approved by the department, from an accredited <u>maritime educational institution</u> [HIRED OR RETAINED BY THE DEPARTMENT] on board the vessel to act as an independent observer for the purpose of monitoring state and federal requirements pertaining to marine discharge and pollution requirements and to insure that passengers, crew, and residents at ports are protected from improper sanitation, health, and safety practices.</u>

(c) Any information recorded or gathered by the <u>person whose presence is</u> <u>required by (a) of this section</u> [LICENSED MARINE ENGINEER] shall be promptly conveyed to the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation and the United States Coast Guard on a form or in a manner approved by the commissioner of environmental conservation. The commissioner may share information gathered with other state and federal agencies.
