A BILL

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

1 "An Act allowing certain members of the uniformed services, spouses and dependents of 2 certain members of the uniformed services, and individuals attending certain merchant 3 marine vocational programs to remain eligible for the permanent fund dividend during 4 absences from the state; allowing, in certain cases, an otherwise eligible individual to file 5 for an unclaimed permanent fund dividend if the parent, guardian, or authorized 6 representative failed to claim a dividend on behalf of the individual during the 7 application period; and providing for an effective date."
