FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

- "An Act relating to the obstruction or hindrance of lawful trapping of game; and
 providing for an effective date."
 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
 * Section 1. AS 16.05.790(c) is amended to read:
- 5 (c) It is an affirmative defense in [IN] a prosecution under this section
 6 (1) [, IT IS AN AFFIRMATIVE DEFENSE] that the person was
 7 lawfully entitled to obstruct or hinder the hunting, fishing, trapping, or viewing of fish
 8 or game; or
- 9 (2) for disabling a trap or snare on public land that the person

 10 (A) was lawfully using a public trail, park, campsite, or
- other facility; and
- 12 <u>(B) disabled the trap or snare based on the person's</u>
 13 <u>objectively reasonable belief that disabling the trap or snare was</u>
 14 necessary to protect the welfare of the public or private property.
