# FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

- 1 "An Act relating to law enforcement requests for wireless telephone location
- 2 information in emergencies."
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
- \* **Section 1.** AS 42.20 is amended by adding a new section to read:
- 5 Article 5. Emergency Wireless Telephone Location Disclosure.
- Sec. 42.20.400. Providing wireless telephone location in emergency. (a) At the request of a law enforcement agency, a wireless telephone company shall provide the available current or most recent location of a wireless telephone to the agency
- 9 without delay if the agency asserts that
- 10 (1) the telephone was used to place a 911 call requesting assistance in an ongoing emergency; or
- 12 (2) the agency has a reasonable basis to believe that the telephone is in 13 the possession of an individual who is in an ongoing emergency that involves the risk

of death or serious physical harm.

disclose the location of a wireless telephone consistent with applicable law.
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(c) A wireless telephone company and its officers, agents, and employees are
not liable for providing the location of a wireless telephone to a law enforcement
agency while acting in good faith in compliance with (a) of this section.
(d) A wireless telephone company authorized to do business in the state shall
annually by June 15 supply the department with emergency contact information that
can be used to request the location of a wireless telephone under (a) of this section and
shall immediately inform the department of any changes to the contact information.
(e) The department shall maintain a database containing the emergency
contact information submitted under (d) of this section and shall provide the
information without delay at the request of a law enforcement agency or emergency
communications center.
(f) The department shall adopt regulations to implement this section.
(g) In this section,
(1) "department" means the Department of Public Safety;
(2) "emergency communications center" has the meaning given in
AS 11.56.785(b);
