A RESOLUTION

Supporting Recover Alaska in its efforts to reduce the effects of excessive alcohol consumption.

3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

4 **WHEREAS** excessive alcohol consumption negatively affects all Alaskans and is a 5 contributing factor in many cases of domestic violence, child abuse and neglect, fetal alcohol 6 spectrum disorders, suicide, homelessness, violent crime, incarceration, and death; and

WHEREAS excessive alcohol consumption in the state harms the individual who
over-consumes the alcohol, the individual's spouse and children, innocent strangers, and the
public at large; and

WHEREAS excessive alcohol consumption is a deeply ingrained practice among
 many teenagers, college students, and adults in the state; and

WHEREAS, although efforts to reduce the harm caused by excessive alcohol consumption may present an overwhelming challenge, doing nothing to reduce the harm is unacceptable; and

15 **WHEREAS** Recover Alaska was formed by a group of concerned state residents that 16 includes representatives of the court and criminal justice systems, health care professionals, 1 and public officials, including members of the Alaska State Legislature; and

2 WHEREAS Recover Alaska is pursuing strategies with a variety of stakeholders to
3 effect long-term change, including

4 (1) a statewide comprehensive communication and advocacy strategy for 5 reduction of harm caused by excessive alcohol consumption, especially among children and 6 teenagers;

7 (2) development of a one-stop-shop where Alaskans may find accurate
8 information and referral services for prevention and treatment of and recovery from excessive
9 alcohol consumption; and

10 (3) revision of state statutes governing the sale and distribution of alcohol;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature supports Recover Alaska and its work to reduce the harm caused by excessive consumption of alcohol in the state.
