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HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 24

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

A RESOLUTION

1	Urging the governor and the Alaska delegation in Congress to expedite the responsible
2	development of oil fields in the state to increase the volume of oil transported through
3	the Trans Alaska Pipeline System.
4	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:
5	WHEREAS the 800-mile Trans Alaska Pipeline System is a tremendous benefit to the
6	state; and
7	WHEREAS the Trans Alaska Pipeline System is currently operating at one-quarter of
8	its capacity, and increasing the volume of oil transported through the pipeline would generate
9	revenue for the state; and
10	WHEREAS, in the past two years, the volume of oil transported through the Trans
11	Alaska Pipeline System has increased, and the state wants that increase to continue; and
12	WHEREAS the state is currently in a period of financial limitation and budget
13	deficits; and
14	WHEREAS many new oil discoveries on the North Slope could be developed and
15	could increase the volume of oil transported through the Trans Alaska Pipeline System; and

1 WHEREAS the Pikka field, discovered by Armstrong Oil and Gas, could produce 2 1,200,000,000 barrels of oil, with output as high as 120,000 barrels a day, and is one of three 3 major finds that have shattered assumptions about what is still possible in the most explored 4 parts of the North Slope; and

5 WHEREAS Caelus Energy discovered an estimated 6,000,000,000 barrels of 6 recoverable oil under its current state leaseholds in Smith Bay, with the potential to produce 7 200,000 barrels a day of light, highly mobile oil, which would both increase throughput and 8 reduce the average viscosity of oil in the Trans Alaska Pipeline System; and

9 WHEREAS Caelus Energy's Nuna project is estimated to hold 100,000,000 barrels of
 10 recoverable oil and could produce 25,000 barrels of oil a day; and

WHEREAS ConocoPhillips' Willow discovery is estimated to hold 300,000,000
barrels of recoverable oil and could produce 100,000 barrels of oil a day; and

WHEREAS ConocoPhillips' Greater Moose's Tooth 1 project could produce 30,000
 barrels of oil a day; and

WHEREAS ConocoPhillips' Greater Moose's Tooth 2 project could produce 25,000
 barrels of oil a day; and

WHEREAS ConocoPhillips' 1H NEWS project in the Kuparuk River unit could
produce 8,000 barrels of oil a day; and

WHEREAS Hilcorp Energy's offshore oilfield Liberty project is estimated to hold
 125,000,000 barrels of recoverable oil and could produce 70,000 barrels of oil a day; and

WHEREAS Hilcorp Energy's Moose Pad Development project in the Milne Point unit, which is already under construction, is estimated to hold 30,000,000 - 50,000,000 barrels of recoverable oil and could produce 18,000 barrels of oil a day; and

WHEREAS Brooks Range Petroleum Corporation's Mustang project is estimated to
 hold 40,000,000 barrels of recoverable oil and could produce 12,000 barrels of oil a day; and

WHEREAS several projects, including the Arctic Slope Regional Corporation's Placer project, ConocoPhillips' Fiord West and Tofkat projects, and ExxonMobil's Point Thomson project, could also increase the volume of oil transported through the Trans Alaska Pipeline System; and

WHEREAS all or part of the oil production generated from these projects would
 result in increased throughput in the Trans Alaska Pipeline System, boosting state revenue;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature urges the governor and the Alaska delegation in Congress to do all that is in their power to expedite the responsible development of oil fields in the state to increase the volume of oil transported through the Trans Alaska Pipeline System as soon as possible.
