A RESOLUTION

- 1 Requesting the United States Congress to call a convention of the states to propose an
- 2 amendment to the Constitution of the United States to set a limit on the number of terms
- 3 that a person may be elected as a member of the United States House of Representatives
- 4 and as a member of the United States Senate; and urging the legislatures of the other 49
- 5 states to request the United States Congress to call a convention of the states.

6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- 7 **WHEREAS** the drafters of the Constitution of the United States empowered state
- 8 legislators to be guardians of liberty against future abuses of power by the federal
- 9 government; and
- 10 WHEREAS most Americans now understand that unlimited terms for elected
- 11 representatives to the United States Congress leads to abuses of federal power and no longer
- reflects a democratic process or guarantees a democratic republic; and
- WHEREAS it is the solemn duty of the states to protect the liberty of the people,
- particularly for the generations to come, by proposing amendments to the Constitution of the
- 15 United States through a convention of the states under art. V to place clear restraints on these

and related abuses of power;

BE IT RESOLVED that, under art. V, Constitution of the United States, the Alaska State Legislature respectfully applies to the United States Congress to call a convention of the states for the limited purpose of proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to set a limit on the number of terms that a person may be elected as a member of the United States House of Representatives and to set a limit on the number of terms that a person may be elected as a member of the United States Senate; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that this application shall be considered as covering the same subject matter as the applications from other states to the United States Congress to call a convention of the states to set a limit on the number of terms that a person may be elected to the United States House of Representatives and to the United States Senate; this application shall be aggregated with applications with the same subject matter as the applications from other states for the purpose of reaching the two-thirds of states necessary to require the United States Congress to call a limited convention on this subject, but may not be aggregated with any other applications on any other subject; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that this application constitutes a continuing application in accordance with art. V, Constitution of the United States, until at least two-thirds of the legislatures of the several states have applied for a similar convention of the states; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature urges the legislatures of the other 49 states to apply to the United States Congress to call a convention of the states.

Biden, Jr., Vice President of the United States and President of the U.S. Senate; the Honorable Paul D. Ryan, Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives; the Honorable Orrin Hatch, President pro tempore of the U.S. Senate; the Honorable Julie E. Adams, Secretary of the U.S. Senate; the Honorable Karen L. Haas, Clerk of the U.S. House of Representatives; the Honorable Lisa Murkowski and the Honorable Dan Sullivan, U.S. Senators, and the Honorable Don Young, U.S. Representative, members of the Alaska delegation in Congress; and the presiding officers of the legislatures of each of the other 49 states.
