A RESOLUTION

- 1 Supporting the completion of the Port MacKenzie Rail Extension and the Northern Rail
- 2 Extension; supporting the increase in defensive capabilities at Fort Greely, Alaska;
- 3 encouraging a renewed commitment by the Alaska Railroad to a community-minded
- 4 approach to future rail expansion; and encouraging the development of critical Arctic
- 5 infrastructure.

6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- 7 WHEREAS Alaska is the only state in the United States that borders the Arctic
- 8 Ocean; and
- 9 WHEREAS the United States Department of Defense has expanded the anti-ballistic
- 10 missile facility at Fort Greely, Alaska; and
- 11 WHEREAS the United States Army has developed new training range areas to
- support the Stryker Brigade; and
- WHEREAS Fort Greely is the only military base that is not currently connected to the
- railroad system in the state; and
- WHEREAS a railroad is well suited to provide the transportation support required to

sustain military operations; an	d
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WHEREAS a cost-efficient transportation system would benefit the world-class mining operations located near Delta Junction and projected mining operations near Tetlin; and

WHEREAS a cost-efficient transportation system would benefit the agricultural industry in the Delta Junction area, allowing the agricultural industry to become more cost-efficient and competitive and increasing its ability to expand; and

WHEREAS a railroad would provide a cost-efficient method of transporting goods and services for both mining and agricultural activities in the Delta Junction region; and

WHEREAS the Alaska Railroad system has the capacity to provide efficient transportation services for heavy cargo and large quantities of supplies to the Delta Junction region from the ports of Port MacKenzie, Seward, Whittier, and Anchorage and to economically deliver mining and agricultural products from the region to market; and

WHEREAS the extension of the Alaska Railroad from Port MacKenzie to Houston, Delta Junction, and Fort Greely is consistent with the long-term goals of the Alaska Railroad Corporation and the State of Alaska to extend rail service to the contiguous United States; and

WHEREAS the Alaska Railroad has already completed phase 1 of the Northern Rail Extension project by crossing the Tanana River, which brings the rail line within 70 miles of Delta Junction and Fort Greely; and

WHEREAS the Matanuska-Susitna Borough and the Alaska Railroad have already completed nearly two-thirds of the Port MacKenzie Rail Extension, which brings Port MacKenzie within 33 miles of the Alaska Railroad rail line, which is in Houston and extends on to Fairbanks and the Northern Rail Extension project; and

WHEREAS the completion of the Port MacKenzie Rail Extension will reduce energy and transportation costs, improve air quality, increase the efficiency of shipping bulk commodities and materials to and from Interior Alaska, and provide direct rail access for shipments of liquefied natural gas from Cook Inlet to Fairbanks, North Pole, and beyond; and

WHEREAS the completion of the Port MacKenzie Rail Extension will increase the available supply of natural gas and reduce energy costs for industry and residential customers in many Interior Alaska communities; with increased natural gas supply, that region will realize additional opportunities for natural gas conversion, which will aid in achieving air

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WHEREAS the Alaska State Legislature supports returning to private landowners the ownership rights of formerly private land previously conveyed to the Alaska Railroad that is no longer in use by the railroad, or for affected landowners to receive compensation, including a share of all revenue derived from easements, utility rights-of-way, or other financial arrangements executed by the railroad; and

WHEREAS the communities, neighborhoods, and individuals served and affected by rail expansions should have an active role in planning, considering alternatives, and confirming decisions made by the Alaska Railroad regarding rail expansions;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature supports the completion of the Port MacKenzie Rail Extension and the Northern Rail Extension; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature recognizes the urgency of developing key infrastructure and defense capabilities, considering the investments other nations have committed to the Arctic as well as the increased amount of time needed for those types of projects because of the extreme weather of the region; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature encourages the Alaska Railroad to renew its commitment to a community-minded approach to future rail expansions, including reporting to the legislature regarding the railroad's efforts to improve relations with private landowners, communities, and neighborhoods impacted by past and current operations; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature urges the Alaska delegation in Congress to pursue the completion of the Port MacKenzie Rail Extension and the Northern Rail Extension for the purpose of securing the critical infrastructure that is necessary to improve defense capabilities in the state.
