FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- * **Section 1.** AS 14.03.075(a) is amended to read:
- 5 (a) A school may not issue a secondary school diploma to a student unless the
- 6 student
- 7 (1) takes a college and career readiness assessment or receives a
- 8 waiver from the governing body; and
- 9 (2) receives a passing score on an examination consisting, at a
- minimum, of the 100 questions of the civics portion of the naturalization test used
- by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services under 8 U.S.C.
- 12 <u>1446(b) or is a student with a disability and receives a waiver from the governing</u>
- 13 **body**.
- * Sec. 2. AS 14.03.075(e) is amended by adding a new paragraph to read:

4	(f) If a student does not receive a waiver and meets the examination

8	(a) The board shall adopt
