6	apply to
7	(1) officers in the regular medical service of the armed services of the
8	United States or the United States Public Health Service while in the discharge of their
9	official duties;
10	(2) a physician or osteopath, who is not a resident of this state, who is
11	asked by a physician or osteopath licensed in this state to help in the diagnosis or
12	treatment of a case;
13	(3) the practice of the religious tenets of a church;
14	(4) a physician in the regular medical service of the United States

Public Health Service or the armed services of the United States volunteering services
 without pay or other remuneration to a hospital, clinic, medical office, or other
 medical facility in the state;

(5) a person who is certified as a direct-entry midwife by the department under AS 08.65 while engaged in the practice of midwifery whether or not the person accepts compensation for those services:

7(6) a physician licensed in another state who, under a written8agreement with an athletic team located in the state in which the physician is9licensed, provides medical services to members of the athletic team while the10athletic team is traveling to or from or participating in a sporting event in this11state.

(d) A student who has been removed from participation in a practice or game
for suspicion of concussion may not return to participation in practice or game play
