# FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

- 1 "An Act establishing a private cause of action for unfair claim settlement practices; and
- 2 amending Rules 79 and 82, Alaska Rules of Civil Procedure."

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- \* **Section 1.** AS 21.36.125(b) is repealed and reenacted to read:
- 5 (b) In addition to other penalties and remedies provided by statutory or common law, including penalties and remedies that may be imposed by the director under AS 21.36.910, a person subjected to an unfair claim settlement practice in violation of this section may bring a civil action for damages resulting from the unfair claim settlement practice. The person subjected to the unfair claim settlement practice is entitled to recover
  - (1) actual damages suffered by the person;
- 12 (2) three times the damages awarded under (1) of this subsection or \$500, whichever is greater;
- 14 (3) other relief the court considers proper; and

1	(4) Tull reasonable attorney fees and costs.
