2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- 3 * Section 1. AS 24.10.100 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
- (b) Unless, within the first 90 consecutive days of a regular legislative session,
 including the day the legislature first convenes in that regular session, a bill has been
 passed by the legislature that fully funds an operating budget, a member of the
 legislature is not eligible for a salary after that 90-day period until the first day after a
 bill has been passed by the legislature that fully funds an operating budget, or the first
 day of the next regular legislative session, whichever occurs earlier. In this subsection,
 "passed by the legislature" has the meaning given in AS 01.10.070.
- 11 *** Sec. 2.** AS 24.10.130(b) is amended to read:

(b) Legislators and officers and employees of the legislative branch of
 government may be entitled to a per diem allowance; however, if a bill that fully
 funds an operating budget has not, within the first 90 consecutive days of a
 regular legislative session, including the day the legislature first convenes in that

1regular session, been passed by the legislature, a member of the legislature is not2entitled to a daily per diem allowance for a day the legislature is in session after3that 90-day period until the first day after a bill that fully funds an operating4budget is passed by the legislature or the first day of the next regular legislative5session, whichever occurs earlier. In this subsection, "passed by the legislature"6has the meaning given in AS 01.10.070.

8 (c) The Alaska Legislative Council shall adopt a policy in accordance with (b) 9 <u>of this section and AS 39.23.540(d) regarding reimbursement for moving expenses</u> 10 [APPLICABLE TO ALL LEGISLATORS] and <u>payment of a</u> [AN APPLICABLE] 11 per diem allowance [POLICY]. The policy <u>must apply to all members of the</u> 12 <u>legislature equally and</u> must set conditions for the reimbursement for moving 13 expenses and payment of per diem and prescribe the amounts of reimbursement 14 adapted to the special needs of the legislative branch as determined by the council.

16 (d) The commission shall make available to the governor and presiding 17 officers of each house of the legislature a final report of its findings and 18 recommendations as to the rate and form of compensation, benefits, and allowances 19 for legislators, the governor, the lieutenant governor, and each principal executive 20 department head during the first 10 days of a legislative session. Subject to 21 AS 24.10.100(b), 24.10.130(b), and (g) of this section, and unless a bill disapproving 22 all the recommendations for all officers listed in this section is enacted into law within 23 60 days after the recommendations are submitted to the governor and presiding 24 officers of each house of the legislature, a recommendation as to the compensation, 25 benefits, and allowances for

26 (1) a legislator has the force of law and becomes effective on the first
27 day of the next regular legislative session; and

(2) the governor, the lieutenant governor, and each principal executive
department head has the force of law and becomes effective on the first day of the
fiscal year following the fiscal year in which the recommendation is submitted.
