FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

- 1 "An Act establishing the second Monday of October of each year as Indigenous Peoples
- 2 Day; and providing for an effective date."

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

- * **Section 1.** AS 44.12 is amended by adding a new section to article 2 to read:
- Sec. 44.12.150. Indigenous Peoples Day. Indigenous Peoples Day is established on the second Monday of October of each year to honor the indigenous peoples of the state as the first to inhabit the land that makes up the state and for contributing wisdom, labor, knowledge, and many personal and cultural achievements to the creation and continuing existence of the state. Indigenous Peoples Day may be observed by suitable observances and exercises by civic groups and the public.
- * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect immediately under AS 01.10.070(c).
