## **A BILL**

# FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

1 "An Act relating to employee intellectual property."

# 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

\* Section 1. AS 23.10 is amended by adding a new section to article 1 to read:

- Sec. 23.10.038. Employee intellectual property. (a) A person may not require as a condition of employment that an employee assign or offer to assign the employee's rights in an invention that the employee developed entirely on the employee's own time without using the person's equipment, supplies, facilities, or trade secret information unless the invention
  - (1) relates, at the time of conception or reduction to practice of the invention, to the person's business or actual or anticipated research or development; or
  - (2) results from work performed by the employee for the person.
- 12 (b) A provision in an employment agreement that violates (a) of this section is unenforceable.
  - (c) A provision in an employment agreement that prohibits an employee who resides and works in this state from seeking relief under this section in the courts of
