1 Relating to telecommunications services for certain disabled subscribers; and providing for an 2 effective date. 3 4 * Section 1. AS 42.05.296 is amended to read: Sec. 42.05.296. Telecommunications [TELEPHONE] services for certain 5 disabled [IMPAIRED] subscribers. (a) The commission shall adopt regulations to 6 7 require telecommunications [TELEPHONE] utilities to provide service to 8 subscribers who are deaf, hard of hearing, and speech disabled [IMPAIRED] 9 SUBSCRIBERS] that permits the subscriber to communicate by one or more 10 telecommunications devices [TELEPHONE] with persons of normal hearing and that 11 makes available reasonable access of all phases of public telecommunications 12 [TELEPHONE] service to subscribers of telecommunications services who are 13 deaf, hard of hearing, and speech disabled [IMPAIRED TELEPHONE 14 SUBSCRIBERS]. The regulations must provide for cost recovery through surcharges

added to the [BASIC LOCAL EXCHANGE] rate <u>for each telecommunications</u>
<u>service</u>. The commission shall hold hearings to determine the most cost-effective
method of providing this service.

4 (b) A <u>telecommunications service</u> [TELEPHONE] subscriber is eligible for 5 the service required by (a) of this section if the subscriber is <u>a person who is</u> certified 6 as deaf, hard of hearing, or speech disabled [IMPAIRED] by a licensed physician, a 7 speech-language pathologist licensed under AS 08.11, an audiologist, or the 8 Department of Health and Social Services or if the subscriber is an organization that 9 represents or has a principal purpose to provide services to persons who are 10 [REPRESENTING THE] deaf, hard of hearing, or speech disabled [IMPAIRED] as 11 determined by the commission.

12 * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect July 1, 2018.
