A RESOLUTION

1 Urging the United States Department of the Army to maintain the current level of its 2 combat-capable structure in the state and apply the No Action Alternative provision to 3 both Fort Wainwright and Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA: 4 5 WHEREAS the Supplemental Programmatic Environmental Assessment for Army 6 2020 Force Structure Realignment under which the United States Department of the Army is 7 preparing for a 2020 force structure realignment contains a No Action Alternative provision 8 that is appropriate for both Fort Wainwright in Fairbanks and Joint Base Elmendorf-9 Richardson in Anchorage; and 10 **WHEREAS** Headquarters, United States Department of the Army, is continuing to 11 reduce the maximum number of active duty personnel from a wartime peak of 570,000 12 personnel to 450,000 personnel by the end of the United States government's fiscal year 2017; 13 and

14 **WHEREAS** the United States Department of the Army must reduce and 15 reorganize the structure of its combat-capable forces to achieve the fiscal reductions

1	required by P.L. 112-25 (Budget Control Act of 2011), as amended; and
2	WHEREAS the reduction and reorganization must be consistent with the national
3	military strategy issued by the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff; and
4	WHEREAS the United States Army will be conducting listening sessions at 30
5	military installations across the United States that are being evaluated for potential personnel
6	reductions; and
7	WHEREAS the primary purpose of the listening sessions is to provide members of an
8	affected community with an opportunity to comment on the reductions under consideration in
9	their community; and
10	WHEREAS Anchorage could lose up to 5,300 military and civilian positions at Joint
11	Base Elmendorf-Richardson; and
12	WHEREAS Fort Wainwright could lose up to 5,800 military and civilian positions;
13	and
14	WHEREAS the nation's primary concern must always be national defense and the
15	security of the United States, including Alaska; and
16	WHEREAS the geographic location of Alaska, including its access to polar air routes,
17	provides a vital strategic advantage for current and future Department of the Army missions,
18	force mobilizations, offensive operations, and defensive operations; and
19	WHEREAS Alaska's strategic global position has been recognized since World War
20	II as providing a prime location to defend the United States against the potential aggression of
21	hostile nations, including Russia and North Korea; and
22	WHEREAS, from bases in the state, United States Army combat forces can rapidly
23	deploy by air or sea to areas in and around the Pacific and Europe and can cross the Arctic to
24	Europe faster than by flying from the East Coast of the United States; and
25	WHEREAS the six major military installations, more than 23,000 active duty service
26	members, and more than 37,000 family members of active duty service members in Alaska
27	make the military presence in the state economically important to Alaska; and
28	WHEREAS the military programs of the University of Alaska Anchorage support
29	military personnel and their families throughout the area served by the University of Alaska
30	Anchorage, including by providing extension centers on Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson
31	that offer educational opportunities to about 1,000 military and civilian students with classes

designed so that students can fit coursework into their busy schedules using conventional
 educational environments and electronic and other distance delivery systems; and

WHEREAS the Joint Pacific Alaska Range Complex consists of 63,000 square miles
 of training areas and provides a training and readiness complex that is unique in the world;
 and

6 **WHEREAS** Red Flag Alaska, a series of Pacific Air Forces commander-directed field 7 training exercises, hosts allied nations from around the world in the unrestricted air space 8 needed for the exercises that is found in Alaska, but that is quickly becoming a premium in 9 the United States; and

WHEREAS the proximity of United States Air Force and Alaska Air National Guard
 units to Fort Wainwright and Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson provides joint training
 opportunities for the United States Army units stationed in Alaska and outside Alaska; and

WHEREAS the United States Army and the United States Air Force are located together at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, providing a unique and efficient deployment base for the two military forces; and

WHEREAS Alaska has demonstrated its strong commitment to the United States Army by investing more than \$88,000,000 in transportation infrastructure to provide the United States Army with access throughout the year to training areas for maneuvers in the Joint Pacific Alaska Range Complex; and

20 **WHEREAS** Alaska is the only state in the nation with direct access to the Arctic, and 21 the United States Army soldiers in Alaska are experts in extreme cold weather operations; and

WHEREAS Alaska is home to the United States Army's Cold Regions Test Center
and has been the site of the United States Army's Arctic and cold weather testing since before
World War II; and

WHEREAS Alaska serves as a site activation command for the United States Missile
 Defense Agency; and

WHEREAS the United States Department of Defense recognizes Alaska as an important strategic location and has recently increased and upgraded its missile defense capability in the state;

30 **BE IT RESOLVED** that the Alaska State Legislature strongly urges the United States
 31 Department of the Army to maintain the current level of its combat-capable structure in

1 Alaska; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature encourages the United States Department of the Army to apply the No Action Alternative provision in the Supplemental Programmatic Environmental Assessment for Army 2020 Force Structure Realignment to both Fort Wainwright in Fairbanks and Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson in Anchorage.
