of terrorism; to provide for forfeiture of property used or derived from any crimes of terrorism; to authorize a person injured by an act of terrorism to file an action for damages against a person committing an act of terrorism; and to provide for damages.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 13A-10-155 is added to Chapter 10 of Title 13A, Code of Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

\$13A-10-155.

- (a) Restitution for conviction of any crime under this article shall include any damages incurred by a person or entity including, but not limited to, direct expenses, medical expenses, and lost income. Restitution shall also include damages or costs of any private entity, law enforcement agency, or other governmental agency that participated in the investigation, mitigation, seizure, or forfeiture process for the act of terrorism.
- (1) Funds collected pursuant to any conviction under this article shall first be applied to disbursements to the primary victims, including individuals injured or otherwise personally damaged.
- (2) After the victims are paid in full, any collected funds shall be applied as provided by law.
- (b) Any property, proceeds, or instrumentality of every kind, used or intended for use in the course of, derived from, or realized through the commission of an offense under this article, is subject to civil forfeiture under the Alabama

Comprehensive Criminal Proceeds Forfeiture Act as provided in Article 4, Chapter 5 of Title 15. Property subject to forfeiture shall be subject to pre-trial seizure as provided by Alabama criminal and civil law.

- (c) A person or entity injured in his or her person, property, or business by reason of a criminal offense under this article or his or her estate, survivors, or heirs may file an action for damages in circuit court against the person or entity who committed the act of terrorism or who is criminally responsible as a conspirator or accomplice.
- (1) In addition to actual damages, a person who files an action under this section may recover punitive damages, which in no case shall be less than three times the actual damages sustained.
- (2) The burden of proof shall be a preponderance of the evidence.
- (3) The plaintiff shall also be entitled to attorney's fees in the trial and appellate courts if the plaintiff prevails in the claim.
- (4) The rights and remedies provided in this section are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law.
- (5) The limitation period for a claim brought under this section is five years from the date of discovery of the violation of this article.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
