campaigning for or holding elected offices ranging from 1 2 Governor to members of town councils; individuals holding appointive offices ranging from the heads of state departments 3 4 to members of local planning boards, and individuals employed 5 by public agencies, such as teachers, firefighters, law enforcement officers, school bus drivers, gardeners, 6 7 maintenance workers, social workers, nurses, office workers, and the like; and 8

9 WHEREAS, everyone should be able to agree that the 10 public is best served by an unambiguously articulated policy 11 that clearly distinguishes between the private interests of 12 public officers and public employees and the public duties of 13 those officers and employees; now therefore,

14 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 15 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That there is created the Code of 16 Ethics Clarification and Reform Commission.

17 (a) The commission shall be comprised of the18 following members:

(1) Three members of the Senate, one of whom may not
be a member of the majority party, appointed by the President
Pro Tempore of the Senate.

(2) Three members of the House of Representatives,
one of whom may not be a member of the majority party,
appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

(3) The Legal Advisor to the Governor.

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26 (4) The Attorney General or Chief Deputy Attorney
27 General, who shall serve as co-chair.

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(5) The Executive Director of the Ethics Commission,
 who shall serve as co-chair.

(6) The Solicitor General of Alabama.

4 (7) The Chief Examiner of the Department of
5 Examiners of Public Accounts.

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- 6 (8) A district attorney appointed by the Alabama
 7 District Attorneys Association.
- 8 (9) A circuit judge appointed by the Alabama
 9 Association of Circuit Judges.
- 10 (10) The Supernumerary District Attorney for the11 15th Judicial Circuit of Alabama.
- 12 (11) Two attorneys licensed in Alabama appointed by13 the Alabama State Bar.
- 14 (12) Two attorneys licensed in Alabama appointed by15 the Director of the Legislative Services Agency.
- 16 (13) An individual appointed by the Association of17 County Commissions of Alabama.
- 18 (14) An individual appointed by the Alabama League19 of Municipalities.
- (15) Two individuals appointed by the Alabama
 Council of Association Executives, one of whom shall be a
 registered lobbyist under Section 36-25-18, Code of Alabama
 1975, who represents more than one principal before the
 legislative and executive branches of government and devotes
 more than 50 percent of his or her time to activity regulated
 by the Ethics Commission.

(16) An individual appointed by the Alabama Press
 Association.

3 (b) The appointing powers shall coordinate their 4 appointments to assure the commission membership is inclusive 5 and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and 6 economic diversity of the state.

7 (c) The commission shall meet as soon as practical
8 at a time and place set by the Senate President Pro Tempore.

9 (d) The commission shall be an advisory commission 10 charged with studying and making recommendations to reform and 11 clarify the Code of Ethics and shall report its findings and 12 recommendations to the Legislature by the first legislative 13 day of the 2019 Regular Session of the Legislature, at which 14 time it shall be dissolved.

(e) Upon the request of the chair, the Secretary of
the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives shall
provide necessary clerical assistance for the work of the
commission.

(f) The Alabama Law Institute shall provide
 necessary professional services to the commission.

(g) Each member of the commission may be reimbursed for expenses related to attending meetings by his or her respective appointing authority consistent with the policies of the appointing authority.

(h) Notice of the meetings of the commission shall
be provided in a manner consistent with the rules of the
Legislature pertaining to interim committees.
