This bill would specify that a law 14 enforcement officer may arrest a person subsequent 15 to a traffic accident if there are reasonable 16 17 grounds to believe that the person was driving 18 under the influence. This bill would also authorize a law 19 20 enforcement officer to issue a traffic citation 21 subsequent to an accident to a driver involved in a 22 traffic accident if, based on the personal investigation of the officer, there are reasonable 23 24 grounds to believe that the person committed a 25 traffic offense for which a citation may be 26 written. 27

16	" <u>(a)</u> A uniformed police officer, state trooper,
17	county sheriff, or his or her deputy or member of a municipal
18	police force law enforcement officer as defined in Section
19	<u>36-21-40,</u> may arrest, at the scene of <u>subsequent to</u> a traffic
20	accident, any driver of a vehicle involved in the accident if
21	upon personal investigation, including information from
22	eyewitnesses, the officer has reasonable grounds to believe
23	that the person by violating Section 32-5A-191 contributed to
