3	Relating to crimes and offenses; to amend Section			
4	13A-6-3, as last amended by Act 2023-387, 2023 Regular			
5	Session, Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide for the			
6	crime of manslaughter; and in connection therewith would have			
7	as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased			
8	expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Section			
9	111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022.			
10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:			
11	Section 1. Section 13A-6-3, as last amended by Act			
12	2023-387, 2023 Regular Session, Code of Alabama 1975, is			
13	amended to read as follows:			
14	"\$13A-6-3			
15	(a) A person commits the crime of manslaughter if he or			
16	she does any of the following:			
17	(1) Recklessly causes the death of another person.			
18	(2) Causes the death of another person under			
19	circumstances that would constitute murder under Section			
20	13A-6-2; except, that he or she causes the death due to a			
21	sudden heat of passion caused by provocation recognized by			
22	law, and before a reasonable time for the passion to cool and			
23	for reason to reassert itself.			
24	(3) <u>a.</u> Knowingly sells, furnishes, gives away, delivers,			
25	or distributes a controlled substance in violation of Section			
26	13A-12-211, which contains fentanyl, any mixture containing			
27	fentanyl, any synthetic controlled substance fentanyl, or any			
28	synthetic controlled substance fentanyl analogue as described			



in Sections 20-2-23 and 20-2-25, and the person to whom the 29 30 controlled substance is sold, furnished, given, delivered, or 31 distributed dies as a proximate result of the use of the 32 controlled substance; provided, nothing in this subdivision 33 shall be construed to apply to a licensed physician engaged in the practice of medicine, a licensed pharmacist engaged in the 34 35 practice of pharmacy, or a licensed dentist engaged in the 36 practice of dentistry.

b. It is not a defense to this subdivision that the
person who sold, furnished, gave away, delivered, or
distributed the controlled substance had no knowledge that the
controlled substance contained fentanyl, a mixture containing
fentanyl, any synthetic controlled substance fentanyl, or any
synthetic controlled substance fentanyl analogue as described
in Section 20-2-23 and 20-2-25.

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(b) Manslaughter is a Class B felony."

45 Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose 46 or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of 47 local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements 48 and application under Section 111.05 of the Constitution of 49 Alabama of 2022, because the bill defines a new crime or 50 amends the definition of an existing crime.

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Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately.
