This bill would state that the purpose of 14 this restriction is to prevent potential undue 15 influence, conflict of interest, or multiple 16 17 payments by the state to the person. 18 19 A BILL 20 TO BE ENTITLED 21 AN ACT 22 23 Proposing an amendment to Section 47 of the 24 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 47 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama 25 26 of 1901, as amended, to further provide for the qualifications 27 of legislators.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, is proposed and shall become valid as a part of the Constitution when all requirements of this act are fulfilled:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

7 Section 47 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901,
8 is amended to read as follows:

Section 47.

10 (a) Senators shall be at least twenty-five years of 11 age, and representatives twenty-one years of age at the time 12 of their election. They shall have been citizens and residents 13 of this state for three years and residents of their 14 respective counties or districts for one year next before their election, if such county or district shall have been so 15 long established; but if not, then of the county or district 16 17 from which the same shall have been taken; and they shall reside in their respective counties or districts during their 18 terms of office. 19

20 (b) A person employed by any entity that contracts 21 with any public two-year or four-year institution of higher 22 education in this state may not serve in the Legislature if 23 the person is employed by the entity in a managerial capacity 24 and the person has direct substantive influence regarding the 25 contract between the entity and the institution. The purpose 26 of this restriction is to prevent potential undue influence, 1 conflict of interest, or multiple payments by the state to the 2 person.

3 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 4 shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the 5 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 6 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 7 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 8 state.

9 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 10 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 11 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 12 following description of the substance or subject matter of 13 the proposed constitutional amendment:

14 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of 15 Alabama of 1901, to specify that certain persons employed in a 16 managerial capacity by any entity that contracts with any 17 two-year or four-year state institution of higher education 18 may not serve in the Legislature."

20 This description shall be followed by the following 21 language:
