4 Section 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any time the victim is 12 years old or less and the adult 5 criminal sex offender, as defined in Section 15-20-21(1), Code 6 7 of Alabama 1975, is 21 years or older at the time of the offense, the criminal sex offender shall be surgically 8 castrated before being released from the custody of the 9 10 Department of Corrections. The cost of the procedure shall be 11 paid by the adult criminal sex offender.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
