To make appropriations for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other functions of government, for debt service, and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

9 Section 1. The monies in Section 2 are appropriated 10 from the named funds for the 2018 fiscal year to the state 11 agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the 12 expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all 13 monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of 14 the Alabama Statutes.

For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the following definitions shall be applicable.

21 "Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total22 of all funding sources.

23 "Program" shall mean specific governmental services 24 required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be 25 directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or 1 group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended 2 only for such purposes.

3 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which
4 result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as
5 land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable
6 period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be
7 expended only for such purposes.

8 "Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the 9 payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations 10 of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

"Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts,
grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by
the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

14 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated 15 the amounts set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, 16 17 for other functions of government, for debt service, and for 18 capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, 19 to be paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such 20 other funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much 21 thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be ex-22 pended for the items for which the appropriation is herein 23 made shall not exceed the amount provided therefor, except as 24 provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 through 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, how-25

ever, that regardless of the ending date of any pay period 1 which has been or may be established by the Legislature for 2 3 the payment of salaries of state employees, the entire payment 4 due shall be made from the fiscal year's appropriation in which the pay date falls. 5

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this act or any other act, any amounts from appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2017, to the various state agencies in this act which were unexpended and reverted on September 30, 2017, are hereby reappropriated to the respective offices for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2017.

Any surplus remaining in any 1 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund to any 2 office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency may be 3 transferred, on order of the Governor, to any other 4 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund when 5 6 such appropriation to any office, department, bureau, board, 7 commission or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that 8 office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency.

9 Section 8. In addition to appropriations herein made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions or 10 11 entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in this act, 12 including grants by the Congress of the United States, 13 municipalities or counties, to any department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or 14 15 officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and, in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to 16 17 such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, 18 institution, office or officer to be used only for the purpose or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or shall 19 20 be made. Further, all state, county, municipal and educational 21 entities are authorized to disburse such sums as deemed 22 necessary by mutual agreement between said entities and the 23 State of Alabama, Department of Examiners of Public Accounts 24 to partially defray the cost of auditing services performed by 25 said agency. All such sums are hereby appropriated and

reappropriated if necessary to the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts for audit services, to be expended through the

fund established by Section 41-5-24, Code of Alabama 1975.

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4 Section 9. The Department of Examiners of Public Accounts is hereby authorized to examine as deemed necessary 5 6 all appropriations herein made for compliance with the laws of 7 the State of Alabama. Any examination performed shall be in 8 accordance with the provisions of Title 41, Chapter 5, Code of 9 Alabama 1975. It is the intent of the Legislature that all 10 state agencies cooperate with the Examiners of Public Accounts 11 to provide the information necessary to conduct recovery 12 audits as provided for in Section 41-5-6.1, Code of Alabama 13 1975.

Section 10. Upon certification to the Director of 14 15 Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has 16 ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or 17 other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby 18 appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or 19 commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such 20 department, board, bureau or commission in the amount 21 necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are 22 in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter 23 made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are 24 conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination

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by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are
 not available for the court-ordered payments.

Section 11. All interest earned from funds paid into 3 Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act 4 90-556 and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the 5 6 Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from 7 8 Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal 9 Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd 10 Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are 11 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.

12 Section 12. All encumbered balances of a previous 13 fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions authorized by this Act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 14 15 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal year immediately following the fiscal year for which the 16 17 appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the 18 State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the 19 appropriation or appropriations were made.

20 Section 13. The appropriations made herein to the 21 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 22 the amounts necessary, and said departments, boards, offices, 23 commissions and agencies are hereby directed to make the 24 transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in said 25 amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated in

1 this act and receiving services from other governmental 2 agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a 3 timely manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for 4 such services.

Section 14. All funds collected under Section 5 6 40-12-43.1, Code of Alabama 1975, between the effective date of Act 98-191 and September 30, 2017 are hereby appropriated 7 8 to the Auburn University Center for Governmental Services for 9 the administration of the examiner certification program 10 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards 11 and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1, Code of Alabama 1975. 12

13 Section 15. It is the intent of the Legislature that the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President 14 Pro Tempore in subsection 8 of Section 2A of this act which 15 are not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate 16 17 President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized 18 for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of 19 20 Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama 21 1975.

22 Section 16. The appropriations made herein to the 23 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 24 the amounts necessary to pay the SEIB. The SEIB rate shall be 25 \$930 per month for each full-time employee for the fiscal year

1 ending September 30, 2018. In addition to the amounts otherwise appropriated in this act, there is hereby 2 3 appropriated from the State General Fund in the same 4 proportion as the salaries of the several State officials and employees are paid, additional amounts to pay for the increase 5 in employer contributions to SEIB. The additional amounts 6 7 appropriated in this section from the State General Fund shall 8 not exceed \$9,600,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 9 2018. The Director of Finance shall ensure that first priority 10 shall be given to all General Fund payrolls, including the 11 payroll of the Legislature. State agencies may receive 12 additional allocations from the appropriation made in this 13 section from the General Fund in amounts necessary to pay for the increase. The remainder of this appropriation from the 14 15 State General Fund may be allotted by the Director of Finance to those agencies which receive transfers from the State 16 17 General Fund. The SEIB shall adjust the insurance program 18 wherever appropriate to maintain the aforementioned fixed 19 rate; however, it is the intent of the Legislature that the 20 Board not increase the out of pocket costs to active and 21 retired members.

22 Section 17. It is the intent of the Legislature that 23 the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House 24 Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate 25 Finance and Taxation General Fund Committee, and the Legislative Fiscal Officer of any interagency transfers, of
 any type, including contracting, of any of the funds
 appropriated in this act.

Section 18. If any section, paragraph, sentence,
clause, provision or portion of this act or all or any portion
of any appropriations herein made be held unconstitutional or
invalid, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph,
sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or any
other appropriation or appropriations or portion thereof
hereby made not in and of itself unconstitutional or invalid.

11 Section 19. All laws or parts of laws, general, 12 special, private or local that are in conflict with or 13 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby 14 expressly repealed.

15 Section 20. Each agency of the state funded through 16 the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity 17 for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of 18 this state without regard to sex or race.

Section 21. This act shall become effective October
 1, 2017.
