30, 2019.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
Section 1. The monies in Section 2 are appropriated
from the named funds for the 2019 fiscal year to the state
agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the

expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of the Alabama Statutes.

For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the following definitions shall be applicable.

10 "Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total11 of all funding sources.

"Program" shall mean specific governmental services required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

17 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which 18 result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as 19 land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable 20 period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be 21 expended only for such purposes.

"Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

25 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts,
26 grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by
27 the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

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1 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated 2 the amounts set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, 3 for other functions of government, for debt service, and for 4 5 capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019, 6 to be paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such 7 other funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be ex-8 9 pended for the items for which the appropriation is herein 10 made shall not exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 11 41-19-1 through 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, how-12 13 ever, that regardless of the ending date of any pay period which has been or may be established by the Legislature for 14 15 the payment of salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be made from the fiscal year's appropriation in 16 17 which the pay date falls.

1 Section 3. In addition to the amounts otherwise appropriated in this act, there is hereby appropriated from 2 3 the several funds in the State Treasury, except the Education 4 Trust Fund, and in the same proportion as the salaries of the 5 several State officials and employees are paid, such additional amounts as may be necessary to pay for a three 6 7 percent (3.0%) salary increase enacted in the 2018 Regular Session. The additional amounts appropriated in this section 8 9 from the State General Fund shall not exceed \$14,400,000 for 10 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019. The Director of 11 Finance shall ensure that first priority shall be given to all 12 State General Fund payrolls, including the payroll of the 13 Legislature. State agencies shall receive additional allocations from the appropriation made in this section from 14 15 the State General Fund in amounts necessary to increase total 16 salaries paid from the State General Fund by three percent. 17 The remainder of this appropriation from the State General Fund may be allotted by the Director of Finance to those 18 agencies which receive transfers from the State General Fund. 19

20 Section 4. Notwithstanding any other provisions of 21 this act or any other act, any amounts from appropriations for 22 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, to the various 23 state agencies in this act which were unexpended and reverted 24 on September 30, 2018, are hereby reappropriated to the respective offices for the fiscal year beginning October 1,
 2018.

3 Section 5. In addition to all other appropriations 4 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated 5 such amounts as may be necessary for the fiscal year ending 6 September 30, 2019, to the Retirement Systems of Alabama from 7 the Senior Services Trust Fund to comply with Section 8 41-15C-1, Code of Alabama 1975.

Except as may be herein otherwise 23 provided, amounts herein specifically appropriated shall be in 24 lieu of the amounts heretofore provided or appropriated by law 25 for such purposes. The amounts herein appropriated are the 26 maximum amounts to be expended for the purposes herein 27 designated and in no event shall the maximum expenditure

provided for any items of expense exceed the amount allocated 1 2 herein except as may be further provided for under this act, as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 3 41-19-1, et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and those 4 5 appropriations herein made, except appropriations to the 6 Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board for the purchase of 7 alcoholic beverages, are and shall be subject to the terms, conditions, provisions and limitations of Sections 41-4-80, et 8 seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and the Budget Management Act of 9 10 1976, Sections 41-19-1, et seq., Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 8. Any surplus remaining in any 11 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund to any 12 13 office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency may be 14 transferred, on order of the Governor, to any other 15 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund when 16 such appropriation to any office, department, bureau, board, 17 commission or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that 18 office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency.

Section 9. In addition to appropriations herein 19 20 made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions or 21 entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in this act, 22 including grants by the Congress of the United States, 23 municipalities or counties, to any department, division, 24 board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or 25 officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and, in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to 26 27 such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency,

institution, office or officer to be used only for the purpose 1 2 or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or shall be made. Further, all state, county, municipal and educational 3 entities are authorized to disburse such sums as deemed 4 5 necessary by mutual agreement between said entities and the 6 State of Alabama, Department of Examiners of Public Accounts 7 to partially defray the cost of auditing services performed by 8 said agency. All such sums are hereby appropriated and 9 reappropriated if necessary to the Department of Examiners of 10 Public Accounts for audit services, to be expended through the fund established by Section 41-5-24, Code of Alabama 1975. 11

Section 10. The Department of Examiners of Public 12 13 Accounts is hereby authorized to examine as deemed necessary all appropriations herein made for compliance with the laws of 14 15 the State of Alabama. Any examination performed shall be in accordance with the provisions of Title 41, Chapter 5, Code of 16 Alabama 1975. It is the intent of the Legislature that all 17 18 state agencies cooperate with the Examiners of Public Accounts to provide the information necessary to conduct recovery 19 20 audits as provided for in Section 41-5-6.1, Code of Alabama 21 1975.

22 Section 11. Upon certification to the Director of 23 Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has 24 ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or 25 other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby 26 appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or 27 commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such department, board, bureau or commission in the amount
necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are
in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter
made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are
conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination
by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are
not available for the court-ordered payments.

Section 12. All interest earned from funds paid into 8 Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act 9 10 90-556 and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of 11 12 the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from 13 Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd 14 15 Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are 16 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.

Section 13. All encumbered balances of a previous 17 18 fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions authorized by this Act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 19 20 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal 21 year immediately following the fiscal year for which the 22 appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the 23 24 appropriation or appropriations were made.

25 Section 14. The appropriations made herein to the 26 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 27 the amounts necessary, and said departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies are hereby directed to make the transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in said amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated in this act and receiving services from other governmental gencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a timely manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for such services.

Section 15. All funds collected under Section 8 40-12-43.1, Code of Alabama 1975, between the effective date 9 10 of Act 98-191 and September 30, 2018 are hereby appropriated to the Auburn University Center for Governmental Services for 11 the administration of the examiner certification program 12 13 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1, Code of 14 15 Alabama 1975.

16 Section 16. It is the intent of the Legislature that 17 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President 18 Pro Tempore in subsection 6 of Section 2A of this act which 19 are not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate 20 President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized 21 for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code 22 of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama 23 24 1975.

25 Section 17. The appropriations made herein to the 26 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 27 the amounts necessary to pay the SEIB. The SEIB rate shall be \$930 per month for each full-time employee for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019. The SEIB shall adjust the insurance program wherever appropriate to maintain the aforementioned fixed rate; however, it is the intent of the Legislature that the Board not increase the out of pocket costs to active and retired members.

Section 18. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation General Fund Committee, and the Legislative Fiscal Officer of any interagency transfers, of any type, including contracting, of any of the funds appropriated in this act.

14 Section 19. If any section, paragraph, sentence, 15 clause, provision or portion of this act or all or any portion 16 of any appropriations herein made be held unconstitutional or 17 invalid, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, 18 sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or any 19 other appropriation or appropriations or portion thereof 20 hereby made not in and of itself unconstitutional or invalid.

21 Section 20. All laws or parts of laws, general, 22 special, private or local that are in conflict with or 23 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby 24 expressly repealed.

25 Section 21. Each agency of the state funded through 26 the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity 1 for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of 2 this state without regard to sex or race.

3 Section 22. This act shall become effective October4 1, 2018.
