4 Relating to public contracts; to amend Section 39-3-4,
5 Code of Alabama 1975, to provide requirements for the use of
6 iron produced within the United States for certain public
7 works projects under certain conditions.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

9 Section 1. Section 39-3-4, Code of Alabama 1975, is
10 amended to read as follows:

11 "§39-3-4

12 (a) Any contractor for a public works project, financed
13 entirely by the State of Alabama or any political subdivision
14 thereof, within this state shall use iron or steel produced
15 within the United States when specifications in the
16 construction contract require the use of iron or steel and do
17 not limit its supply to a sole source under subsection (f) of
18 Section 39-2-2. If the awarding authority decides that the
19 procurement of ~~the above mentioned~~ domestic iron or steel
20 products becomes impractical as a result of a national
21 emergency, national strike, or other cause, the awarding
22 authority shall waive the above restriction.

23 (b) In the event the contractor violates the domestic
24 iron or steel requirements of subsection (a), and domestic
25 iron or steel is not used, there shall be a downward
26 adjustment in the contract price equal to any realized savings
27 or benefits to the contractor."

28 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first

29 day of the third month following its passage and approval by
30 the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
