26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

1 Section 1. (a) After the effective date of this act, 2 an emergency communications district may not release the audio recording of a 911 telephone call except pursuant to a court 3 order finding that the right of the public to the release of the recording outweighs the privacy interests of the 5 individual who made the 911 call or any persons involved in 6 7 the facts or circumstances relating to the 911 call. This section shall not apply to law enforcement personnel 8 conducting an investigation where the 911 telephone call is or 9 10 may be relevant to the investigation.

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(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a), any written or electronic record detailing the circumstances, response, or other events related to a 911 call which are kept by the emergency communications district in its regular course of business shall be deemed a public writing under Section 36-12-40, Code of Alabama 1975, and subject to public inspection as otherwise provided by law.

Section 2. All laws or parts of laws which conflict with this act are repealed.

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
