Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of

specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

## A BILL

## TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

To prohibit a person from owning or operating or installing, creating, building, or fabricating a motor vehicle, aircraft, or vessel with a false or secret compartment used to unlawfully conceal contraband or controlled substances; to provide criminal penalties for violations; to provide for the forfeiture of the motor vehicle, aircraft, or vessel and any contents in the false or secret compartment; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as

- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

- Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this section, the following terms shall have the following meanings:
  - (1) AIRCRAFT. Any contrivance now known, or hereafter invented, used, or designed for navigation of or flight through the air and used privately or commercially.
  - (2) FALSE OR SECRET COMPARTMENT. An enclosure integrated into a motor vehicle, aircraft, or vessel, that is a modification of the motor vehicle, aircraft, or vessel, as originally manufactured used to conceal or hide an illegal object or objects.
  - (3) MOTOR VEHICLE. A self-propelled vehicle intended primarily for use and operation on public roads and highways.
  - (4) VESSEL. Every description of watercraft capable of being used as a means of transportation on the water.
  - (b) (1) A person may not knowingly or intentionally own or operate a motor vehicle, aircraft, or vessel containing a false or secret compartment that is used or has been used to conceal a controlled substance prohibited by Chapter 2, Title 20, Code of Alabama 1975, an object that is illegal to posses, or other contraband.
  - (2) A person may not install, create, build, or fabricate a false or secret compartment in a motor vehicle, aircraft, or vessel that he or she or another person intends to use to conceal a controlled substance prohibited by Chapter

2, Title 20, Code of Alabama 1975, an object that is illegal to possess, or other contraband.

- (c) For the purposes of this section, a new owner of a motor vehicle, aircraft, or vessel is not criminally liable for any conduct in violation of subsection (b) which occurred prior to the transfer of title of the vehicle, aircraft, or vessel, provided he or she had no knowledge of the conduct and takes steps to change the motor vehicle, aircraft, or vessel back to its original design when made aware of the modification in violation of this section.
- (d) A violation of subsection (b) is a Class D felony.
- (e) A motor vehicle, aircraft, or vessel containing a false or secret compartment used in violation of this section, as well as any items in the compartment, are subject to seizure by a state or local law enforcement officer with jurisdiction over the property. The procedures for forfeiture and the disposition of the property and any proceeds shall be subject to Article 4, Chapter 5, Title 15, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the

- bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an
  existing crime.
- Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
